On the last day of the greatest Jewish festival, the Lord Jesus stood up and called out to everyone who was celebrating. 

Growing up as a teenager,

we had many problems at home with my father, and I desired to leave the house. When I met my husband, I saw it as an opportunity to escape the house and be happy with him. I thought getting married would make me happy, but I was wrong. I left the house against my parents' will but was desperate; I felt I was going after my happiness. In the first week of our marriage, my husband started to mistreat me and cheat on me. He was very jealous and, at times, would follow me at work because He did not trust me even though he was the one cheating on me.

Because of the problems in my marriage and the abuses of my husband, I started to feel empty inside. I left him many times but ended up coming back, and as the children came along, I didn't dare to go anymore because I could not support my two children alone, so I had to endure the suffering. I felt so much pain inside that my soul would scream because of that pain, which I did not understand what it was. I always thought of a way to stop suffering inside, but I didn't know how. I reached a point where I tried to commit suicide, and when I was about to put the rope around my name, I heard someone calling my name. I hid the rope under the bed, but when I went out, no one was there. Until today, I don't know who called my name that day, but I understand that it prevented me from hurting myself. From that day, I fell into a deep depression.

I could not eat or sleep; life lost its color. It was so bad that even at work, my boss noticed something was wrong with me. I explained everything to her, but no one could help me. One day, when I left work, I saw a Universal Church next to my workplace. This church has always been there, but I haven't noticed it all this time. I went inside, and it was like the pastor spoke directly to me during the service. He talked about my life in detail, and I did not understand because it was my first time in this place. Today, I know that it was God speaking through the pastor. After the strong prayers, I felt different; when I went home, I was already different.

I decided to continue coming, making a chain of prayer for my total deliverance. The more I went to church, the more I realized that I needed God,

The fights were constant and included knife threats.

Amanda and Rafael's lives were marked by turbulent periods. Still, the discovery of the Universal Church and its Love Therapy lectures generated a turning point and completely transformed their lives.

Before becoming an example of overcoming obstacles alongside her husband, Amanda, aged 30, says she experienced many bad relationships as a teenager. "I carried traumas from past relationships, disagreements, physical and verbal violence, addictions, and betrayals," she says.


When she was 18, she believed everything would change after she met Rafael, her husband, who is now 32 years old. "At the begin-ning, we had an enchanting expe-rience," he recalls. However, the promising future they dreamed of was left behind with the discovery of their first pregnancy and Rafa-el's inappropriate behavior: "At the beginning of my pregnancy, he left me at home every weekend to go out. I found myself alone at the moments I needed him most."



Little by little, the relationship took an unexpected turn, with constant verbal fights and, eventually, physical attacks. "We binged on drinks and often discussed ending the relationship, but we never went through with it. Over time, our connection began to fray. Things got worse when I became pregnant with our second daughter. We were already physically attacking each other, but the situation intensified. The fights took place in front of our daughters; they were constant and included threats with a knife," she

Amanda explained that the betrayal committed by Rafael took the union to rock bottom: "I faced a problem with excessive alcohol consumption, while my husband, in addition to drinking, also dealt with addictions to pornography and drugs. When I discovered his betrayal, I felt like I hit rock bot-tom; I felt lost," she recalls.

LIGHT AT THE END OF THE TUNNEL



The change only occurred when Rafael, a locksmith, sought help in the Universal Church after receiving an invitation from his brother. Amanda, who was initially resistant, saw her husband's change as a light at the end of the tunnel.

The family prayer meetings were essential for the couple to learn the importance of respect, companionship, and communication. "I realized that I did not assume my responsibilities as a father or husband. I neglected my tasks and other obligations. Instead, I spent my time and resources on bars, gambling, and drugs. God set me free from the addictions and traumas when I started to seek Him truly," says Rafael.

Their relationship grew stronger, and they got married at the Wedding Celebration at Solomon's Temple on June 3, 2021. Today, with almost 12 years together and three years married, they have a transformed love life and family. "Our life and family are very blessed and wonderful. The light of the Holy Spirit guides and leads us."

Their home is now a place of peace, and their family is united. The power of the Almighty saved and transformed their family.



THE CRUEL SIDE OF DEPRESSION

An inexplicable pain that finds shelter in the soul and hijacks the natural rhythm of life. Because of it, dreams fall apart, and people waste away. The current scenario indicates the greatest depressive crisis of all time.



enturies ago, in a dark time, prisoners were thrown into a dungeon and left there, cruelly alone, wasting away in the company of their thoughts. It is also in this dungeon that many people live today because they are depressed. Only those who are trapped in this disease know precisely the pain it causes. The core of the matter is that those who watch it from the outside tend to ignore it and conclude that "it's no big deal."

Unfortunately, not a few people experience this painful sensation. Currently, around 300 million people in the world suffer from the disease, as indicated by figures from the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO).

The 2022 World Mental Health Report already pointed to the worsening of mental disorders worldwide, with an increase of more than 25% in new cases of depression and anxiety, and, according to the WHO, this was "the largest review of global mental health since the turn of the century." In just the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic, 53 million people developed depression, and another 76 million had anxiety, totaling 129 million. "The numbers clearly show that the burden of depression (in terms of losses for those affected) is likely to increase so that by 2030, it will alone be the biggest cause of losses (for the population) among all health problems.", said doctor Shekhar Saxena, from the WHO Department of Mental Health, in an interview with BBC.

The organization estimates that depression is likely to become the most common disease in the world, affecting more people than any other, including cancer and heart disease. There is another curious

fact: after 24 years, the Ministry of Health updated the list of work-related diseases, which now contains 347 more diseases that cause damage to the physical or mental integrity of the worker, including depression.

It's no surprise that depression makes headlines in the news around the world. An article on The New York Times website detailed the devastating way that depression and anxiety affect the body, highlighting that mind and body form a two-way street: "An untreated mental illness can significantly increase the risk of becoming physically ill and physical disorders can result in behaviors that worsen mental conditions."

According to the American magazine Time, "There is a surprising increase in severe depression among teenagers in the United States." You can read in the article: "(...) although anxiety and sadness are not new phenomena among adolescents, there has been a significant increase in the percentage of young people between the ages of 12 and 20 who reported having had a major depressive episode".

When it comes to preschool children, another report from the outlet noted that they could suffer from severe depression. A study published in JAMA Psychiatry found that, in a group of 193 children aged between 3 and 6 years, 90 had a diagnosis of major depressive disorder.

The pain of abuse at the age of 8 devastated self-esteem and value of Marciela, who began to live with silence and guilt. It affected her to the point where she didn't feel like studying. "I started to suffer from insomnia; I felt a lot of sadness and body pain, as well as having bad thoughts and a desire to die. As a result of the abuse, trauma, and fear also arose, and soon, drugs entered my life. But it was at the age of 14 that I became aware of some symptoms that had already announced depression. My grandmother raised me, and I blamed my mother for what happened to me," she says.

Marciela learned that her mother had been diagnosed with a skull tumor. "That was my rock bottom: The depression got much worse due to the guilt I started to carry. Furthermore, I felt incapable of taking care of her. In the state I was in, how would I take care of my mother if I couldn't even take care of myself?" she asks. That's when, at

"The doctor prescribed strong medication to wake me up, another one in the afternoon to cheer me up, and one more at night so I could sleep. At first, I felt fine, but days later, my condition worsened as I woke up and couldn't feel my body, which was numb. It was a shock, and, in my desperation, I remembered

Sometimes, I saw depression as an attempt to get attention, but when I started comparing the symptoms I had with those reported by patients, what distressed me most was knowing that, clinically, depression was a disease that had no cure and that, in most cases, progressed tragically. On several occasions, I saw death as a way to put an end to suffering, especially when I was driving my car,"

he says.

He was three years in condition. grandmother maternal knew about the Universal Church, but I had a huge prejudice. One day, when I was driving on the road, returning home, I found myself very distressed, with many voices disturbing me. The only thought that was going through my head was that I would take my own life. So, I decided to turn on the radio so as not to do anything stupid. I stopped a Universal Church program, and it was the voice of Bishop Macedo. When I was about to turn it off, he said: 'You who are in that car, desperate, thinking about taking your own life, don't do it! There's a way out

for you.' Then I thought, 'Is he talking to me?'" Geyzon then decided to seek help. "I was very well received at the Universal Church and the emptiness I felt disappeared with just one prayer. I saw that there was something different in that place, and from that day on, I decided to give myself to the Lord Jesus and soon freed myself from depression. Today, I am a complete man, married to a wonderful woman, professionally accomplished. I have the opportunity to help people who come to the church in the same situation I was once in," he concludes.

SINCE I WAS A CHILD, I DREAMT OF BEING THE

name is Dayane, and since I was a child, my dream was to be a criminal's girlfriend. I grew up where I would see a bunch of violence, and at the age of ten, this desire began; I was just a child, but this is what I wanted. As time passed, I made a lot of friends, but through these friendships, I started drinking, smoking, and using drugs. Through these friendships, they introduced me to a mutual friend who was incarcerated.

I asked them to allow me to have his contact so I could begin a relationship with him. I was 17 years old at the time and could not go to the prison so that we could converse over the phone, but as soon as I turned 18 years old, I went to the prison to see him.

My name is Ednei, I met Dayane when I was in prison. My friend knew of her from a mutual friend outside and introduced us. However, I didn't want to know anyone at this time. My thoughts were only when I would be released to get out, do my dirty work, and continue doing wrong. So, I wasn't thinking of having any relationship with anyone. But, through our mutual friends, I gave in and decided to give the relationship a chance.

After three and a half years, I was released. I met new friends in my neighborhood, and we started doing drug trafficking; I was the trusted man, and we brought the drugs to the house, but Dayane was the head. She would tell me what to do, to distribute the drugs.

DAYANE:

I felt like my dream was being fulfilled; I was always the first to enter and the last to leave. My "dream" was being fulfilled, but I never had happiness. We drank a lot, and we



wanted to kill Ednei, I put a gun to his head. Ednei:

Once again, I was arrested and went to prison; I remember I had a minimum sentence of eight years. But I remember I would always see one assistant from the UBB volunteering there. He would greet me, but he would always say one day, I would be on the other side helping him to save souls in prison. I started to think, so I made a vow to God there in prison.



I asked God to give me a chance because I never made a prayer like this before; I wanted to see if God was real. I was set free not long after, and immediately, I went to look for the universal church.

DAYANE:

I suffered from insomnia and one night, I saw the bishop on the TV, and he made an invitation for all who watched. I decided to go to the Universal Church, and I obeyed everything I heard the pastor say. I received my deliverance, and not long after, I decided to get baptized in water.

After my baptism in the water, I went to seek the holy spirit; I made my vow in the church and presented it to God. I cut everything wrong I did and began to pray more, seek God more, and open my hands to God. I placed my life in His hands, all of me. My thoughts, depression, and insomnia all my life were on the altar. After this, I

used so many drugs, but I came to a point where I had the assurance that the Holy Spirit was in me. Immediately, I received joy and peace. I knew I was no longer alone. The greatest treasure is the Holy Spirit; I would not trade it for anything.

I saw a pastor there, and he spoke to me in front of the altar and said, if I place my life in the hands of God on the altar and do not take my life from there, God will transform my life. God showed me that the drugs I was taking were no good, and I threw away all of them.

I received my deliverance, was baptized in water, and began to seek the Holy Spirit. I told God, I need Your Spirit. I told Him if I do not have Your Spirit, I will not be able to persevere; the Holy Spirit

transformed me; there was an old me and a new me. The most fabulous riches I have is the Spirit of God.

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WHY HAVE I BEEN DISCOURAGED?

iscouragement and moments of weakness come to all of us. That's not the problem. The problem is when discouragement is part of your life, and the lack of strength becomes your normal state. You are usually feeling weak and discouraged. You have moments of encouragement, but your normal state is of discouragement. What could be behind this?

"For immumerable evils have surrounded me" (Psalm 40:12).

The psalmist, King David, knew well what it was like to be surrounded by evil and more evil. For many years, he was persecuted and hunted. He lived in hiding in caves.

Those words were from someone who knew what it was like to be surrounded by enemies. Problems may cover you, and there is no doubt that discouragement hits when we are like this.



But something else can also happen: a giant can be born. We can grow through these problems. You know that when a person faces a threatening situation, they discover a strength they didn't know they had.

If the person had not thought, he would not have jumped a high wall, but by seeking survival, they discovered a capacity that they did not know they had. You can awaken

iscouragement and moments of this giant inside you and overcome all weakness come to all of us. That's not these evils, as David did countless times.

"[...] My iniquities have overtaken me so that I am not able to look up; They are more than the hairs of my head; Therefore my heart fails me" (Psalm 40:12).

Please pay attention: David was discouraged not because of his enemies but because of the iniquities that trapped him, so he could not look up. The discouragement, which many face daily (the person can't even take a shower or get out of bed), is because, perhaps, they are carrying guilt. You don't forgive yourself; this is in your head every day. And you stay in this state of death in life.

So, what's the way out? How did King David get rid of it? You find the answer in Psalm 51, when he opened his heart, humbled himself, confessed his sin, asked for forgiveness, recognized that he made a mistake, and threw himself at God's feet asking for mercy.

He believed not because he deserved forgiveness but because no one deserves forgiveness. And at that moment, God forgave him, taking away the burden and guilt. With his head held high, the one who could not look up now went to thank God and recovered what he had lost.

That's also what God wants to do for you. Suppose you are so bad that you can't look up. In that case, you can't say a prayer. Initially, look down and ask for forgiveness, repent of what you have done, and believe in the promise, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us" (1 John 1:9). Make that promise come true in your life.

Once this weight of your guilt is taken off your shoulders, you will see that the guilt will leave you, and the strength will return.



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




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enis had many financial issues for several years, which he only overcame when he understood he needed to stop complaining. He comments that he was always proud and that when he tried to solve problems, he used his strength and emotions to solve them.

Denis focused on being successful financially and professionally, and even after starting his family, his priority continued to be making money. His desires always came first, but this caused him to have more problems. He began to dedicate himself to working many hours a day and still could not have financial security. Instead, surprisingly, he went into debt. He reveals the reason for this: "I was unbalanced. I even had a good salary, but it wasn't enough for the lifestyle I was trying to maintain. For example, I went on many trips, and my debts only increased."

Many efforts to resolve his financial problem affected other areas in his life, including the marital one; after all, he did not give attention to his wife. Furthermore, the businesses he tried to undertake were not successful. Because of that, he was overwhelmed with negative thoughts and compared himself to others. Murmuring was frequent in his daily life. "I put myself in a victim position. I even began to doubt the existence of God. I fought about everything and always wanted to resolve things brutally," he comments.

However, the more he complained, the worse

the situation got. "My situation was so bad that when my salary was deposited into my account, it only served to cover the negative balance I had in my account. I even opened an account at another bank so I could at least have some of my salary to cover my basic needs," he recalls.

Without seeing the light at the end of the tunnel, Denis remembers that his wife invited him to a meeting at The Universal Church. He started going, but still, he didn't change his behavior. When his projects came true, through his prayers, he forgot about God. When problems arose again, he immediately ran to Him and asked for help, as he says: "I treated God like my waiter. I thought things had to be my way, and when they weren't, I started complaining again."

With a debt of almost \$200,000, Denis understood that he needed to stop running away from reality. "I decided to obey everything God said and asked for his direction. I started making the right decisions, especially when negotiating my debts, and always acted honestly. So miracles started happening," he says.

Denis started to put his priorities in order, and he began to experience true prosperity. "I put God first and then my family.



Today, I am completely transformed and have a happy family. I have a prosperous life and, above all, inner peace," he guarantees.

He says that the man who was previously insecure about facing problems gained wisdom and strength to overcome difficulties with the Holy Spirit: "Today, no matter how big the problems are, for me they are small because the God that I serve is great and powerful," he concludes.

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
