

eparationfrom God happens when there is the presence of sin and, consequently, the devil.

No one on earth can live with God and sin at the same time because it would be like wanting to live in the light and darkness at the same time or drinking fresh water and salt water at the same time.

Not even the Son of God, Jesus, who can do all things, could do this. Actually, this was the worst pain ever felt in humankind's history: He, the Son of God, was sent by His own Father to come into this world and be taken to Calvary as a sacrifice because of God's love for us.

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life," John 3.16

We can not imagine the pain that the Lord had, giving His only begotten Son to this rotten world and going through everything He went through – being that He could have sent the angel Gabriel or Michael or another angel He confided in. But He tore out from within Himself the best He had and placed It (Jesus) on the altar at

as a sacrificial offering and received an infinite number of children. And you, what have you done for love, faith, and obedience to this God?

What does this say about the Lord Jesus? His most brutal pain was not the nails that were hammered into His hands or feet, nor was it to bear the diseases of humankind, but to spend a few hours separated from the Father, for taking our sins upon Himself (Matthew 27:46). His despair, terror, and agony to be alone on that cross was so great that He sweated drops of blood.

"Then an angel appeared to Him from heaven, strengthening Him. And being in agony, He prayed more earnestly. Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground." Luke 22.43-44

# The Fast of Daniel

# A time to focus on what matters

March 31st. It is an opportunity to distance oneself from the distractions of everyday life in order to seek the Holy Spirit and strengthen one's faith.

Many people wait for the perfect moment to start a project or change something in their daily lives. However, this is also true regarding decisions about one's spiritual life. If this is your case, now is your chance; there's no excuse left: the Fast of Daniel, which began on March 11th, is a great opportunity for all those seeking to draw closer to God, strengthen their faith, and obtain the fullness of life.

The purpose lasts 21 days and will end on Easter Sunday, March 31st. This day refers to the journey of the Lord Jesus and His sacrifice. Therefore, these days will be days when we will walk like Him.

In an interview with Universal News, Bishop Adilson Silva, a Bishop here at the Universal Church, explained that this purpose of faith is intended for those who want to receive the Holy Spirit and those who already have Him but want to consecrate themselves to God.

#### Walking with Jesus

The Fast of Daniel will allow participants to draw inspiration from Jesus' lessons and words and strengthen their communion with the Father to prepare for life's challenges. The proposal is to do a different fasting: instead of depriving oneself of food, the person should detach himself from the excess of secular content, news, social networks, and everything that steals his peace and generates anxiety, stress, and worry. That way, they'll have more time to Karina invest in their faith.

For Bishop Adilson, this purpose is unique, as it represents a moment in which the Holy Spirit finds greater receptivity in the human being and more freedom to speak to him. "The Fast of Daniel is essential for our spiritual life. And, of course, if someone is fading in faith, they will be revived by participating in this Fasting," he says.

The Fast of Daniel began on March He also says there is no excuse for not par- mercy lasts forever," she concludes. 11th and will end on Easter Sunday, ticipating in the Fasting: "When someone says they can't do the Daniel Fast, the correct thing would be for them to say, 'I don't desire the Holy Spirit as much as I say I do.' After all, from the moment a person thirsts for Him, he will keep his focus on Fasting and, in this way, he will receive the Holy Spirit," he concluded.

> This 21-day journey of the Fast of Daniel marked the life of the self-employed Karina Aires da Silva (pictured below), 41 years old. She says that after growing cold in her faith and turning away from God, she began to live and do everything that displeased Him. "I started going to all kinds of clubs, I had a lot of relationships, and I got addicted to drinking. Then I began to have insomnia, to hear voices, and to live in anguish and depression. I attempted suicide to take away the pain in my soul. I lost everything," she says.

> Karina's situation deteriorated until she missed the church and communion with God and wanted to return to the faith. Then, she asked for help from a couple of church assistants and began the struggle to free herself from the evils that plagued her.

> The transformation trajectory was long, and Karina confesses that she always thought about giving up everything. Still, the assistants prevented her from going backward. "One day, I decided to change, and it was during the purpose of the Fast of Daniel, so I decided to do what was right. I began to deepen my relationship with God, and each time the desires of the flesh came, I worked even harder on the things of God," she says.

#### I sunk into depression



Angie Andrade sunk into depression after her marriage fell apart. She had lost the will to do anything, even to care for her hygiene and health; she just wanted to stay in her room all day.

"Depression had led me to neglect even my hygiene and to think about suicide. I was deteriorating. I only wanted to stay in bed and didn't have the desire to do anything. I had no desire to work, to eat; I didn't see a reason to live anymore."

For Angie, life had lost all meaning. She spent many nights unable to sleep with sadness, and the recurring idea of ending her life bombarded her mind. She believed that the rest of her days would continue in sorrow and suffering. But the love she still felt for her family held her back from falling into the temptation of suicide.

"I had suicidal thoughts constantly. I even planned to take pills to kill myself, but I thought about my family and the sadness it would cause them, and this made me even more sad, and I decided not to go through with it. But I would cry all day.

Tears consumed Angie's life, but one day, the opportunity to get to know the Universal Church appeared before her. She immediately went in search of relief from her sorrow. She was so relieved in the first days that she persevered and participated in the prayer chain until she became a new woman and regained her self-confidence

"After my first visit to Universal, the suicidal thoughts left. I didn't feel like dying anymore. As I continued coming, I became a woman who was happier and more confident, a new woman. I was delivered from the depression. I found true and complete happiness through the Holy

After being freed by the grace of the Holy Spirit, she felt ready to rebuild her life. God placed a new man on her path, whom she married, and she has rediscovered love and formed a family.



When we talk about the cross, people immediately remember the act of the Lord Jesus, which is why it became one of the main symbols of Christianity, but they mistakenly associate it with death. The custom of using the cross in death executions is ancient. In Rome, Italy, the act of crucifying represented the humiliation of a condemned person, and, in Jesus' time, it was an instrument of torture that was characterized by curses and suffering. However, the cross stopped having this negative meaning when the Lord Jesus was nailed to it. "Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree") (Galatians 3.13).

When the Lord Jesus was crucified, He carried upon Himself every sentence of condemnation, every curse, and every suffering. With this, the Son of God, who had never committed any sin out of love for sinful Humanity, took its place, sacrificed His Own Life, and became Victor so that everyone could be free and saved (Isaiah 53:5-6).

The cross—the object in itself—does not emanate power and should not be worshipped. Its meaning, however, is that it was modified after that sacrifice. The two opposite sides of the cross represent the relationship between life and death, the spiritual and earthly worlds, and condemnation and redemption. Thus, through the blood of the Lord Jesus shed on the cross, all Humanity found forgiveness, the chance to start over after a past of mistakes, and the victory he provided.

However, only some people benefit from its meaning despite celebrating Good Friday and having a cross at home or among personal objects. "Although it is a symbol of something so strong, as they are unaware of the real meaning of the cross, most people use this symbol only as an amulet. Many make the sign of the cross and carry a cross-shaped pendant but continue to live within the limits of pain, misery, and suffering."

From the moment people understand the true message of the cross, they begin to take possession of a right. "It is an acquired right that was given to us when Jesus died on the cross and paid the price for our spiritual freedom. Only when people understand this can they benefit from what Jesus did."

Thus, Jesus' sacrifice is related to life change. "Regardless of a person's past, no matter how great their mistakes or sins may have been, when they recognize them, accept what the Lord Jesus did for them, and receive Him as their Lord and Savior, all of their past is nullified.

# I WAS SHOT FOUR TIMES, WAS RESCUED, AND THEN IMPRISONED...

obody believed in the change of Edimario. He, his parents, and his seven siblings moved to another city to escape their precarious life. As soon as they arrived in the big city, he says there were many difficulties, starting with the death of his father as a result of alcohol abuse. After a year, the family suffered another loss: that of Edimario's older brother, who was the victim of a hit-and-run. Edimario started working at a very young age, but simultaneously, he went down the wrong path. "At 14, I started working, and at 16, I started smoking marijuana. Soon, I was consuming cocaine, alcohol, and other drugs. My life was limited to partying, drugs, and prostitution, and I had an emptiness that nothing could fill. Drugs and prescription medication covered up depression and anguish."

He was also unsuccessful in his love life. Not even the four children he had with different women sustained the relationships. His difficulties in staying at work led him to become a market vendor. Still, the initiative did not work out. Out of pride and shame, he abandoned his family and went to live in a community, and there, his downfall was greater.

He tells how he started to live: "I started dealing in drug trafficking and carrying out petty thefts and robberies in homes and cars, and, in one of them, I was caught in the act. Because it was the first time, I left the next day. Still, I continued to commit crimes and began to seek guidance from evil spirits for everything I intended to do. By supplying drugs, I made a lot of money and made a lot of enemies." He remembers a situation: "I was shot four times, was rescued, and then imprisoned for two months. However, I was released once again. I didn't listen to anyone's advice, and I went into drug trafficking again." Leading that life, he was an accomplice in a murder and, months later, killed someone. He was arrested for the third time, and his sentence was estimated at 30 years. He explains the consequences of this: "I was overcome by despair and the desire to escape, but I was transferred to another prison. There, after two weeks, I managed to escape with other prisoners. Then, I changed my house, my appearance, and my documents. Still, I was aware that I was a fugitive and that I was responsible for two homicides." Thus, he delved deeper into crime.

Sometime later, Edimario met

someone who invited him to the Universal Church. He went with her to a meeting on a Friday and remembered that a message stuck with him: "I heard from the pastor that, if I wanted to, my life could change. The other Friday, I went to church again until I decided to stop crime, and this girl and I started living together. People in crime asked me what I would live on and said I was hiding behind the Bible."

Edimario's money ran out as the days passed, and his partner abandoned him. People thought he would return to crime, but he continued attending Universal. The desire for change grew in him: "I got baptized in water and, in a purpose of faith, I sacrificed more. I wanted the Holy Spirit, but I knew I was a fugitive.

Then thoughts of accusation came into my mind, saying that I was a murderer, a thief and that Jesus

didn't want me", he claims. In the meetings, Edimario understood the real meaning of the cross and took possession of his right. "When I understood that on the cross the Lord Jesus had carried all my sins so that I could have life, everything changed. I overcame


a c c u s i n g t h o u g h t s, forgave myself, and received His Spirit."

"The Holy Spirit

showed me He was with me, and I did evangelistic work inside the prison. I confessed to my crime and was sentenced to 20 years and four months. When I was transferred to the state prison, I continued evangelizing there and was promoted to assistant. Two years later, I switched to the semiopen regime. That's when I met my wife, who is now an assistant."

After ten years of imprisonment, he gained freedom and married thanks to good behavior. He works with his wife today, and God has blessed him in all areas.

"I went back to studying, God restored my relationship with my children, I have two grandchildren and a happy marriage, but the most important thing I have is the Holy Spirit, who forgave me, supported me in prison, and changed my story," he says.

constantly feeling lonely and scared; I remember being in many arguments and fighting and being left with other family members. I was left with someone when I was about five years old whom I guess my parents had trusted, and that person had taken advantage of me.



I could remember that person's smell and anything that smelt like that or something similar made me very uncomfortable. I wanted my mom to be there, but she wasn't, and when she was, she was very abusive.

I would get dressed as if going to school and skip classes to the point where I needed to call home. Eventually, my mom told me to go back to where I came from, and they called the police, and I was taken to a children's home.

ne of the earliest memories of my life was I was 14 years old at the time. I would drink and smoke, trying to fill the void in me and cope with all the pain I had been through. One day, I and these "friends" of mine saw a lady leaving from



Many times when God tells us "no" it is because He is protecting us from ourselves. Our timing is not always the right time, so, let's be patient and trust the Master above.







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# "WE ATE SPOILED RICE BECAUSE THAT'S ALL

WE HAD."

Matos is part of a family of four brothers. "I grew up in a

motherless home with an alcoholic father, and I was five years old when my mother abandoned us. We went hungry because, although my father worked, he spent most of his salary in bars. We ate spoiled rice because that's all we had," she explains.

At the age of 10, Patricia

started smoking secretly. At the age of 13, she started drinking and committing petty theft. At the age of 15, she became aware of the crime life, and many people wanted her dead. She talks about other problems she went through: "I hated my mother, and with that, I started to hate everyone around me. I became so aggressive that I no longer knew how to talk to anyone. I got into fights with armed men and didn't care about my life. I just wanted them to see that I wouldn't let anyone else make me suffer. At 17, I started using cocaine and had two overdoses. I lived in an abusive relationship, suffered betrayal, and was attacked.

With the death of my friend, with six shots to the face, I began to hate people more. I already had two daughters and considered giving them to a couple to raise. However, because my mother abandoned me, I wasn't able to do that to them."

Patricia had another child in another relationship, which did not work out either. "I used to beat my eldest daughter a lot, who was only five years old. I spent days and nights out drinking and using drugs and left her alone to take care of her little brothers. Sometimes, she would look for me at the bar. I started bringing people into the house and using drugs and having sex with them, and my daughter often witnessed everything. One Sunday night, when I was giving dinner to my middle daughter, she choked. I slapped her because I thought she was playing, but the next thing I knew, she was actually choking. She was

treated at the hospital, but the doctor delivered the news: she had passed away. She was six years old," she describes.

highlights her Patricia "My feelings: world collapsed and, with it, all hope I had left in me. I always had the thought that life was very unfair to me and, therefore, I carried hatred, hurt, sadness, an inferiority complex, and a desire for revenge. Then, with the death of my daughter, I started to feel suicidal. I no longer ate or showered."

Patricia's sister invited her to go to The Universal Church. "When I saw the Name of the Lord Jesus, I asked Him to be the Lord of my life. That day, I felt such great peace! I hugged my daughter and promised that we would be happy. I knew how unfair I had been to my children, especially towards her. I freed myself from addictions and thoughts, but I couldn't forgive myself. Until I understood that if He had forgiven me, I would have to forgive myself, too. Then, I encountered God received the most precious thing: the Holy Spirit. Today, I have peace. I raise my children, and we lack nothing on our table. With my daughter's death, I gained two more daughters. I am complete for having God in my life," she concludes.







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
