crisis of faith often begins when we stop exercising it. Just like muscles that weaken without activity, faith also withers when it isn't actively practiced. Without regular use, faith becomes complacent, eventually turning into mere religious

God allows us to face difficulties precisely to prevent our faith from becoming a tradition rather than a living force. In the past, the Holy Spirit warned His servants of this tendency, knowing our nature to seek comfort.

Yet, when we encounter trials—whether in our family, relationships, or health—it's easy to turn to God with complaints, feeling like we're constantly swimming against the current. What many don't realize is that God is using these situations to urge us to activate our faith.

God's guidance emphasizes that faith must be a continuous action, the only path to true victory and salvation. It is "from faith to faith" that we make progress, securing our longed-for salvation.

However, our adversary, the devil, works



tirelessly to undermine this gift, setting traps and creating distractions to shift our focus away from faith. When he succeeds, faith can fade, leading to spiritual decline.

While God doesn't cause our problems, He does allow them to sharpen our faith. Faith is a Divine tool with the power to shield us against any attack from the enemy. But we must use it every day, right up to our last breath. A well-exercised faith is resilient, capable of neutralizing any difficulty that comes our way. So let's embrace challenges as opportunities to grow, keeping our faith alive and vibrant.

#### BEATING DEPRESSION

Depression is more than just sadness—it's a deep, overwhelming sorrow that affects the very core of a person. It brings feelings of hopelessness and creates a heavy void that drains motivation, making even the simplest tasks seem impossible. In severe cases, depression can make people lose the will to live. It's like a sickness of the soul. But who can heal the soul? Only the Savior, the Lord Jesus, has the power to restore a troubled heart.





Before coming to the Universal Church, Diana describes herself as a happy person. But that changed when she met her husband at a young age. At only 16, she thought moving in with him would offer a better life. But soon, she discovered he was addicted to drugs—a reality that shook her to the core. "I didn't know anything about drugs and suddenly, I was living with it daily," she shares.

Diana's life spiraled into fear, sleepless nights, and heartbreak. Her husband used all kinds of drugs, and she even saw him doing so with other women. The relationship grew

toxic; he became abusive in every way—verbally, mentally, and physically.

"I lost all motivation. Every Friday was a nightmare. He'd come home, and it was like we were cursed to fight," she recalls. This cycle went on for 14 years, a time marked by constant moves, financial struggles, and deep emotional

Despite his addiction, Diana's husband was the sole provider, even as their instability forced them to move from one apartment to another. He attended church, but it had no effect on his behavior—he'd leave services only to get drunk or high. Though his mother persistently invited him to the Universal Church, he refused, declaring,

"I have my own God. I'm never going to change." But one day, Diana convinced him to give it a chance. He reluctantly agreed, knowing he had nothing left to lose.

A turning point came when he tried cocaine again, only for his body to have a severe reaction. It was as if God had intervened, delivering him from the drugs. Since that day, he hasn't touched drugs or alcohol.

Today, Diana and her husband live a life they once thought impossible. They own a construction business, have their own home, five trucks, and can enjoy life's blessings without fear.

"There are no more fights. I sleep peacefully now. My husband and I call each other throughout the day, and we have a life of harmony," she says. Both have received the Holy Spirit, and Diana emphasizes that it has given them true security and salvation. "The Holy Spirit transformed our lives completely. I invite you-don't hesitate. God will change your life, too."



My knee was swollen, and the doctor told me I'd need surgery to remove the effusions. Basically, they'd have to cut into my knee for the procedure. Hearing this made me feel stressed and depressed. To make things worse, I was also diagnosed with cervical cancer. Around this time, I saw this ministry on TV and started attending.

I refused to accept suffering with these health problems. I began coming to the healing services and learned how to make the chain of prayers by faith. I am now healed from cervical cancer and no longer need knee surgery. I am also free from depression, as I received the Holy Spirit, which gives me true peace.

#### THE BIGGEST WEAPON AGAINST THE FAMILY



ne of the most powerful weapons used to destroy families today is separation. Once a family becomes divided, it begins to fall apart. This can happen in many ways—between siblings, when a family member runs into legal troubles, struggles with addiction, or faces marriage or parenting issues. Sometimes, one person turns their back on another, pointing out faults, making accusations, and spreading negativity throughout the family. Before long, the entire family is at odds.

The Bible is clear about the danger of division. In Matthew 12:25, Jesus warns, "Every city or house divided against itself will not stand."

Here's my advice: When your family faces challenges, don't add to the problem. Don't step on them or make things worse. Instead, be the one who stands up to help. If you can't solve the issue yourself, seek help. The first place to turn is to God—He created the family and knows how to restore it.

It only takes one person to transform a situation. Are you the one willing to make a difference?

May the God of the Bible bless you and bring peace and unity to your family.

#### I WAS LEFT WITHOUT A FAMILY FROM ONE DAY TO THE NEXT



uciano Soares, 49, a boilermaker, had an incredibly difficult child-hood, marked by financial hardship and emotional pain. He grew up with his parents and seven siblings near a landfill, where they worked collecting recyclable materials and searching for food scraps just to survive. "We lived near a landfill, where we worked retrieving materials for recycling and looking for food scraps to feed ourselves," Luciano recalls. His poor conditions led to rejection at school and an inferiority complex, leaving him feeling isolated and disconnected from the world. His father's absence weighed heavily on him, and his mother, though his greatest companion, also struggled, especially after the landfill that provided their livelihood was closed. With no means to support the family, his mother turned to alcohol and tragically passed away from a stroke. "I was left without a family from one day to the next," Luciano says. "With her death, each brother went his own way, and my father got involved with another family after two weeks. I was left alone at the age of 16."

Without his mother's comforting presence, Luciano felt lost and aban-

doned. He eventually moved in with his sister, but things only spiraled further out of control. He began stealing cars and using drugs, a downward spiral that would last for years. "I used any type of drug. I started with perfume, alcoholic beverages, and 'mushroom tea.' Soon I was using marijuana, cocaine, and crack. Anything they offered me that would make me forget reality, I accepted," he explains.

Luciano's life continued to spiral into darkness. After two years of stealing and selling cars, he reached a breaking point, using drugs all night with the intent to end his life. When he returned home, he was met with "With the death of my mother and the absence of my father, I found myself lost in the world..."

more devastating news—his brother-in-law had died in a car accident. The guilt and accusations overwhelmed him, leading him to further intensify his drug use and criminal activities.

The dangerous path he was on eventually led to death threats. Fearing for his life, Luciano considered fleeing to escape, but after listening to his girlfriend (now wife), he realized that running away wouldn't solve anything. Feeling utterly lost, he withdrew for a few days. It was during this time that a friend invited him to the Universal Church, and his life began to change.

From the very first day he attended church, Luciano felt an internal shift. "I stopped using drugs, I isolated myself from everything and everyone, and I began to understand God. He was restoring me into society," he says. Though the process wasn't easy, Luciano started to learn how to live a different life. He went back to school, found a job, and secured a place to live.

Three years of spiritual change and inner healing brought Luciano to his greatest breakthrough—the discovery of the Holy Spirit. "Before, we had nowhere to live, but today we have a house, a car, and a family restored by the mercy of God," he shares. "I was freed from addictions and the weight of the past and rejection. But, regardless of the assets I have acquired, my greatest asset is the Holy Spirit, and my greatest testimony is to remain in the Faith," he concludes.

## What's happening at the Universal Church



#### "Our dysfunctional upbringing led my husband and I to the brink of divorce"



For years, I thought my husband's transformation would be the key to restoring our family. I believed if he changed, then peace and happiness would follow. But as I looked deeper, I realized the real transformation had to begin within me. I was burdened with trauma, depression, and anxiety from my past. I didn't know how to love, nor did I know how to give love because I hadn't experienced it myself.

Growing up, I believed that happiness had to come from someone else. I put unrealistic expectations on my husband, which led to constant fights and arguments. Both of us came from dysfunctional backgrounds, which impacted our marriage. My husband grew up witnessing his parents in constant conflict, while I faced the absence of a father figure and endured trauma from a young age. This left me with a harsh personality. We would verbally abuse each other, and as financial problems arose, I became even more bitter and disrespectful, to the point where I wanted to end our mar-

One day, I accompanied my mother to the Universal Church. We went in after one of the assistants invited us inside while my mom was contemplating suicide. Growing up in church, I'd always known about God, but I had never fully surrendered my life to Him. This time, I made a decision to truly give myself to God, opening my heart to Him completely. I realized that if I held onto my hatred and resentment, I would end up destroying myself. That decision led me to an encounter with God, and shortly after, I received the Holy Spirit.

Since that day, the emptiness and sadness I'd carried for years vanished. Now, I understand that without God and without the Holy Spirit, none of my achievements or possessions would have any true meaning. God gave me the love I lacked, allowing me to love my husband, care for our daughter, and treat others with kindness and patience. I no longer needed a father figure because I found my Father in God. Our lives have improved in every aspect. Financially, we are doing well—my husband owns his own business, and I work as a nurse.

For anyone experiencing marital issues, I would say to invest in the Holy Spirit. You can't give what you don't have. If you don't possess genuine love, it's impossible to share it with others. Only God can fill that void and provide you with the guidance and patience needed for a fulfilling life. If I hadn't received the Holy Spirit, I wouldn't have witnessed the restoration of my family.

### "God transformed my children"

Jenny and Diana were born and raised in the church, following in their mother Marcella's footsteps. Marcella, a dedicated servant of God, hoped her daughters would one day join her in ministry, believing they, too, would embrace a life of faith.

"My children were born and raised in church," Marcella explains, "So my thoughts were that they too would do the work of God at some point in their lives.'

But life took a different turn. Jenny and Diana started attending church and participating in its activities primarily to please their family, not out of genuine conviction. Jenny recalls, "There was a time in my life when I was coming, attending meetings, being part of everything. But at some point, I lost interest. I felt controlled, like I was being forced to learn about God." As she struggled with feelings of restriction, her life outside of church became a way to rebel. Smoking, drinking, and sneaking out led to deeper struggles with depression and anxiety, even to the point of having suicidal thoughts."

Diana's experience was similar but centered around her dreams for the future. She had big ambitions-attending university, moving to New York, traveling the world with friends. Church, to her, could always be something she returned to later. "I always had a thought in the back of my head saying, I can always come back to God, but right now, I want to experience life," she

Marcella, faced with her daughters' struggles, felt powerless and heartbroken. In her grief, she realized she hadn't fully surredered them to God. "We were in a vigil, and I started praying," she remembers. "God said to me, 'You didn't give me your kids.' That was hard to accept. I thought I'd put them on the altar, but God made me realize



I pushed them for things in the world and not as much for the altar. I realized I could do more, and at that moment, I felt like I failed God."This realization prompted her to trust in God, letting go of her own efforts to control the outcome. She committed to a purpose of faith, stepping back and trusting God's timing. Within three months, things began to change.

Diana found herself back at church, initially to please her mom, but during a special period of fasting, something shifted. "I started to take things more seriously," she says. Jenny, too, had a turning point, fed up with the pretense and the depression. "I was tired of pretending to be someone I wasn't. I had seen lives transformed, and after so many years of ignoring it, I decided I wanted that too," she reflects.

Today, Marcella sees the power of God reflected in her family. "Every time I see my family, I see God. The changes in them weren't done by me or by them. God did that. Put your kids on the altar and let God take care of the rest."For Marcella, it was a journey of releasing control, allowing God to work in His timing. And for her daughters, it was about discovering faith for themselves, leading to a transformation only God could achieve.

That's the secret to a truly happy family? Contrary to the polished images on social media, real happiness in a family doesn't come from beautiful photos or vacations together. Building a strong, joyful family takes daily effort and resilience. After all, if even siblings raised in the same home have their differences, sharing life with someone from a different background can be even more challenging. Life itself brings emotional struggles, highs, and lows that can test any family.

How many families today live under the same roof but don't actually connect? Arguments, resentment, individualism, addiction, dishonesty, judgment, and excessive criticism are just a few issues that can strain the delicate balance of family life.


psychologist According to interpersonal relationship expert Denise Camargo, many family difficulties stem from a lack of true communication. "Conversations are essential, but it's important to know how to have them. Each person needs to listen without judgment or accusations. Feelings like anger and resentment often prevent productive dialogue," she explains.

When two people choose to marry, they each bring experiences, disappointments, and life lessons from their family of origin. Dr. Roberto Debski, a psychologist, reminds couples to be mindful of how past experiences impact their new family. "Everyone brings some baggage, but they must also be open to growth, creating a better model together," he says.

The Bible also emphasizes the importance of caring for family. Deuteronomy 5:16 highlights honoring father and mother, a fundamental principle. Another passage underscores that true believers should never neglect their family: "But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever" (1 Timothy 5:8).

Dedication to family is essential to maintain peace and unity. "We cannot overlook our family responsibilities. The challenges we face in the world are immense, but that's no excuse," says Dr. Camargo. If you cherish your family, stay informed, and fight with all your strength, asking God for guidance to protect, uplift, or restore it when needed. Remember: family is God's sacred project.

S: I remember my mom used to have so many purses because she was obsessed with them.

ideal. The apartment my stepfather provided was rundown, with crumbling walls and damaged floors, and often lacked basic necessities.

Worse than the poor conditions, though, was the abuse I witnessed. My stepfather's violence toward my mom left me with images that I couldn't shake—finding blood on the floor and feeling helpless to protect her weighed heavily on me.

This trauma fueled an anger in me that I carried into school. I couldn't focus because I was constantly worried about what might be happening at home.

Eventually, I began lashing out, bullying others as an outlet for the turmoil inside. By the time I was 17, I was fully caught up in gang life.

Soon, the consequences caught up with me. I was in and out of prison 42 times, and the police knew me by name.

I turned to drug dealing, following the path laid out by the only people I knew: gang members, drug dealers, and criminals. Our gang became



rowing up my home was far from so notorious that officials publicly vowed to clear us out of the neighborhood. My choices took a toll on my mom. I saw the despair in her eyes, knowing my actions caused her so much pain and worry.



"But I didn't know how to stop. Beyond the criminal lifestyle, I battled spiritual issues—I shadows, saw heard voices, and suffered from intense insomnia. I was haunted, restless, and empty inside."


Finding the Universal Church was a turning point for me. No one judged me for my past; instead, they gave me a chance to start over. My transformation didn't happen in an instant—it took a commitment to God, faith, and perseverance.

n Monday, November 4th, UBB made a powerful spiritual impact at the Stringfellow Unit. The day began with a challenge: just hours before we were set to head out, we learned that the unit had no electricity. But Bishop Joshua declared, "We will bring the power." Sure enough, as soon as our team arrived, the electricity returned.

The event kicked off with a graduation ceremony for approximately 80 men who had successfully completed the Overcoming Anger class.

Bishop Joshua prayed over the graduates and



encouraged them to hold onto what they'd learned, as it would be essential when they re-enter society. Chaplain Leith joined him on the altar, congratulating the men on their perseverance and motivating them to look forward to the next class.

Following the ceremony, a full dinner was served, featuring turkey, chicken, ham, rice, mashed potatoes with gravy, salad, stuffing, beans, cranberry sauce, and dinner rolls.

For dessert, the men enjoyed cake, pies, and iced tea—with enough for seconds. One inmate shared, "In my thirty-seven years in prison, I've never had food like what you brought for us." At 6 p.m., the service began, and the men were eager to be spiritually filled. Inmates who had been watching UBB videos on their tablets and praying with Bishop Joshua while drinking blessed water stepped forward to share their testimonies.

They spoke of healing, deliverance from drugs and alcohol, and the transformation from destructive behaviors to a life following Jesus. Bishop Joshua led a powerful prayer of faith



with the men, breaking down the walls of team's presence, the uplifting words, the challenges in and around their lives. With a prayers, and the entire service, which left them united shout of determination, they claimed feeling revived and encouraged. As we packed victory over these walls.

The message of salvation followed, opening the men's eyes to the importance of building their lives on the Word of God.



Bishop Joshua shared the story of Jacob, who, while fleeing his father's house, slept in the wilderness with a stone as his pillow. Joshua spent time with the men in deep prayer. The inmates expressed their gratitude for the
































### **REAP PROSPERITY TODAY**



ike many people around the world, 56-year-old Roberto Silva had heard of God and even believed in His existence, but to him, the Creator seemed distant and indifferent to his pain. "I was in debt, had family problems, and even attempted suicide. I didn't value my life. I had heard a lot of negative things about the Universal Church and didn't like it, but after hearing the testimonies, I decided to attend one of the meetings," he says.

Roberto wanted to change his financial situation and was willing to follow the teachings he received. "I was baptized in water and learned about being faithful to God. At that time, I wasn't even faithful to my family. Even though I earned a good income, the money disappeared, and I always ended the month overdrawn. Despite my situation, I made a commitment to God and started putting Him first," he explains.

This act of faith, along with the teachings he put into practice, changed his life. "My thoughts changed: I no longer had the desire to commit suicide or feel anxiety. I started putting in more effort and grew

financially. I left my job and started my own business. Despite initial difficulties, I carried God's Word within me and trusted it would work out. In three months, I tripled my earnings, paid off all my debts, learned to organize myself, and things started to fall into place," he says.

However, even though he was a faithful tither and regular church-goer, his priorities were still centered on the blessings, not the Blesser. This became clear as he grew financially. "At that time, my tithe also grew, and I started seeing it just as money, no longer being faithful to God. Gradually, things started going wrong, sales dropped, I stopped praying, I no longer evangelized, and God was no longer my priority," he reveals.

This went on for three months until he decided to make things right with God. "I took the initiative to make a vow at the Altar, and from then on, I put all my strength into pleasing God—not just financially but in every area. I truly prioritized God, and He rewarded me. My spiritual life changed, and I received the Holy Spirit. I began to understand the value of marriage, met a woman

of God, and got married. I also kept growing professionally," he describes.

Roberto's transformation started from within, beginning with his decision to prioritize God and follow His Word. "I had nothing before, and I recognize that everything I have achieved, He gave me. Today, I am faithful and have become a sponsor of God's Work, so that it may reach more people," he concludes.





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
