

Depression has become one of the most widespread mental health challenges of our time. According to Mental Health America, it impacts more than 21 million adults annually in the U.S. alone—around 8% of the population. Among youth aged 12-17, 3.7 million are affected yearly. In 2023, nearly one-third of all adults reported experiencing symptoms of depression or anxiety, as shown by the Census Bureau's Household Pulse Survey. Some common symptoms of depression include:

- Persistent sadness or feelings of emptiness Hopelessness, guilt, or worthlessness Restlessness or irritability

- Loss of interest in hobbies and activities
- Constant fatigue or lack of energy
- Difficulty concentrating
- Appetite changes
- Thoughts of death or suicide

These symptoms can make day-to-day life feel overwhelming, causing distress and disrupting routines.

Do any of these signs resonate with you? Are you finding it harder to engage with your responsibilities, withdrawing from loved ones, or turning to unhealthy coping mechanisms? Or perhaps someone close to you is struggling, and you feel powerless to help. A tree that is planted by the rivers of water has its guarantees...

"Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful, but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night. He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth its fruit in its season, whose leaf also shall not wither; and whatever he does shall prosper." Psalm 1:1-3

n a world where many seek guidance from the opinions of others, the psalmist reminds us that true success comes from aligning ourselves with God's Word. Those who are unsure of their direction often walk in the counsel of worldly wisdom, but those who fear God seek His wisdom. They find joy in meditating on His law day and night, filling their minds with His truth, which removes any room for doubt.

The counsel of the ungodly leads only to confusion, and the path of sinners may appear inviting, but it is ultimately a trap. There is no real safety outside of God's protection.

Those who meditate on God's Word and live according to it are compared to a tree

It all began when I was just 14 years old. My family was falling apart. My parents fought constantly, leaving me and my brother desperate at home. During these fights, knives were pulled out, and threats were made. Eventually, my father left home for good, and the weight of it all was too much for me to bear.

The home problems overwhelmed me, and I sank into deep depression. At school, I was invisible—not recognized by my peers, not even by my own family. I had no desire to leave the house. I lost weight, and all I wanted to do was sleep, escaping the pain in any way I could. I often questioned why I was even alive, as life seemed meaningless. I felt like a burden to my family and couldn't see a way out.

Then one day, I happened to see a TV program from the Universal Church. The testimonies I heard gave me hope. Despite being so young, I felt something stir inside of me. A little while later, a neighbor invited me to the church, and I accepted. I just wanted the sadness and weight to lift from me.

My mom came with me, and that day marked the beginning of my new life with God. When we arrived, the pastor counseled me, and I found myself in tears, as if God Himself was listening

to me. He prayed for me, and from that moment on, I was never the same.

That prayer broke the chains of depression and emptiness that had weighed me down for so long. I continued attending the church, learning how to use my faith. I came to understand that the greatest gift anyone can receive from God is the Holy

Now, at 31 years old, I can confidently say that depression has never returned. My life is blessed in every way-financially, with my family, my marriage, and my health. But the greatest blessing I have is the Holy Spirit, living within me. I have found true happiness and peace, and I am fulfilled because of Him.

FEAR NO EVIL



any people, whether believers or not, are familiar with passages from the Bible. rowing up, my life seemed fine until everything changed during my teenage years. I left my parents' house to live with friends, thinking I'd finally be happy on my own. I was rebellious and didn't want anyone telling me what to do, which is why my stepfather eventually sent me away.

But living with friends was nothing like I expected. It was then that I truly understood what suffering meant. The people I trusted believed in witchcraft and started doing things against me. My life spiraled downhill. Depression set in, and I felt completely empty and alone. I started having nightmares and couldn't sleep at night. I was terrified of the dark and hated being alone, so I always needed someone around me.

Eventually, I moved back in with my mom after she separated from my stepfather, but things didn't improve—in fact, they got worse. I fell into bad company, got involved with guns, and started partying excessively. I was desperate to fill the void inside me. I went from one toxic relationship to another, even with married men and women, but nothing gave me the peace I was searching for.

I became addicted to marijuana and filled with bitterness. Depression consumed me, and suicidal thoughts plagued my mind. I tried everything to escape the pain in my soul, but nothing worked. I thought the only way to find peace was to end my life. I attempted suicide multiple times, but each time, I failed.

When I thought all hope was gone, someone invited me to the Universal Church. At that moment, I was on the verge of committing a murder. A friend begged me to visit the church before going through with it. I didn't care about life

anymore—whether I ended up in prison or dead didn't

would be a one-time visit. That day, as I sat at the back of the church, something unexpected happened. For the first time in years, I felt peace—a peace I couldn't explain.

I decided to keep coming back. As I learned more about God's Word, I realized that I didn't truly know Him, even though I had attended church in the past. That's when I made the decision to surrender my life to God.

I got involved in the Youth Group and started learning what it meant to live as a child of God. I let go of all my destructive relationships, gave up smoking, stopped partying, and was freed from the nightmares and paranormal activities that once haunted me. God gave me the peace I had been searching for all my life.

After repenting and being baptized in water, I sought the baptism in the Holy Spirit, knowing I couldn't live without Him. Today, my life has been completely transformed. I no longer struggle with depression or suicidal thoughts. I'm at peace, and my greatest desire is to share the same God who changed my life with others so they can experience His love and transformation too. Tashannah

I grew up in a home filled with constant fights and arguments between my parents. Their frequent conflicts took a toll on me and began to affect me deeply. As a result, I became two different people. To my friends and family, I was Juliana—the happy, fun-loving person who always enjoyed spending time with others. I was seen as the funny, "happy-go-lucky" girl. But inside, I was the complete opposite. I struggled with depression, feeling empty and alone even when surrounded by people.

As I entered adolescence, these feelings grew stronger. I felt pressured to be someone I wasn't, and the sadness only deepened. There were times when I would isolate myself from everyone, crying for no reason and battling many suicidal thoughts. I convinced myself

that the only way out of this overwhelming situation was to end my life. There were moments when I stood at the train station, fighting the urge to jump, but something always stopped me.

One day, at school, I became friends with a Christian who attended the Universal Church. She shared with me about Jesus and invited me to a youth gathering at the church. I was reluctant at first because I didn't believe in God, but I decided to go. When I entered the church, something felt different. There was an energy that intrigued me, and I felt a pull to keep coming back. As I continued to attend, I began to see changes in my life. Slowly, I started to regain hope and saw the possibility of a better future.

I began seeking the Holy Spirit, and I remember the day I received Him as if it were yesterday. It was on April 11th. All the sadness, anguish, and suicidal thoughts that once consumed me disappeared. I was overwhelmed by a joy and peace that I had never experienced before. That day, I found the hope I had been searching for all along. I've never battled depression again, and all the bitterness in my heart was replaced by true happiness.

Maria spent years battling illness and hopelessness.

"For seven years, I suffered greatly with ulcers and gastritis. My body was in constant pain, and I couldn't eat properly. This caused me to lose a lot of weight, and I became unrecognizable. For months, the only food I could manage was milk—I survived on that alone," she shared.

In the eyes of doctors, her situation seemed impossible. The more she searched for a solution, the worse it became. "I visited several doctors and specialists, spending everything I had in search of relief. But all I heard from them was that my condition was advanced and incurable. They told me death was inevitable," Maria recalled.

This left her in despair. She sank into a deep depression, overwhelmed by sadness and frustration. "I was without hope, with no expectations. I had young daughters who needed me, but I couldn't help them," she said.

But when all seemed lost, Maria found the solution she had been desperately seeking. "I received an invitation to visit the Universal Church, and I accepted it because I had noth-



ing left to lose. I had already tried everything else—hospitals, doctors, and people—but none of it helped,' she explained.

At the Universal Church, Maria was introduced to intelligent faith. Through this faith, she learned how to trust God and embrace His promises. "I was healed from the gastritis and ulcers. I can now eat, sleep well, and live a normal life," Maria said joyfully.



ecent findings from a CDC survey in the United States have revealed alarming statistics about the rise in depression and dissatisfaction among young people, with women being disproportionately affected. In 2021, nearly three out of every five girls reported experiencing profound sadness, and one-third of them even considered suicide.

Depression doesn't just affect the mind—it causes real, internal damage. The American Psychiatric Association defines depression as a persistent sad or empty mood, accompanied by changes that significantly impact one's ability to function. Common symptoms include lack of motivation, constant fatigue, apathy, insomnia, and negative life perspectives. Those suffering often report feeling inexplicable pain, even though it's not physical.

As Bishop Edir Macedo explains, depression is a "state of despair of the soul." He adds that the feeling of profound emptiness is the deepest pain for those suffering from depression, but many fail to see that depression is a soul issue. It's a struggle that leaves people crying without understanding why, under constant oppression, and caught in a battle of thoughts that suggest there's no way out.

However, this isn't the end. Even though psychiatric treatments and medications often fail, there is a powerful solution: treating the soul with the Word of God. As Bishop Macedo says, "treating depression is treating the soul," and the only way to heal the soul is by immersing in the Scriptures and absorbing the Spirit of the Bible.

The greatest mistake is to live with depression, managing the pain for years without seeking help. If you or someone you know is suffering from depression, don't wait for it to destroy your soul. Seek help today. Visit a Universal Church near you and find the healing that comes from the Word of God. Healing begins with acknowledging the need for help and trusting in God's power to restore the soul.

""I started to feel useless as if I was not needed and invisible."

abrina Brum, a 29-year-old administrative assistant, shares how her childhood experiences shaped her sense of self-worth and led her to search for meaning in destructive ways. Growing up with her father's alcoholism and her mother's absence due to work, Sabrina felt alone and rejected from a young age. "I grew up feeling alone. Since I was little, I thought I was rejected," she reflects.

Her feelings of inadequacy were exacerbated by bullying at school, where her appearance made her feel inferior and unworthy. These emotional wounds led to deep existential crises. "I started to feel useless as if I was not needed and invisible."

At the age of 12, Sabrina turned to alcohol as a way to cope with the inner chaos she felt. "I started to use alcohol as an escape because it seemed like my mind and heart were in turmoil." As her alcohol dependence grew, she also developed depression, anxiety, and panic attacks. In an attempt to numb the pain, she sought validation through fleeting relationships and parties, only to feel emptier. "I felt used," she says. "God, I need You"

During one of her darkest moments, Sabrina experienced a panic attack that left her powerless. In desperation, she cried out, "God, I need You." To



her surprise, the crisis stopped, and this moment marked the beginning of her belief that her life could have a different purpose. "I thought: 'I need God,'" Sabrina recalls. This realization led her to return to the Universal Church, where she had attended as a child, and to participate in a campaign of faith.

Determined to surrender her life to God, Sabrina gave up her own desires and plans. "God wanted me to belong to Him, to be His daughter." It was at this point that Sabrina felt truly welcomed by God.

The most significant

transformation in her life came when she received the Holy Spirit. "The Holy Spirit is everything to me. He guides me, consoles me, gives me direction, brings me balance and sobriety," she explains. With the Holy Spirit in her life, Sabrina found a new perspective on life and discovered true joy. "Today, I have peace. This peace, which is everything to me, comes from the Holy Spirit."

A new purpose

Sabrina is now dedicated to helping others find the same peace that transformed her life. She emphasizes that true happiness does not come from material things or temporary



accomplishments. "My greatest achievement, without a doubt, is the Holy Spirit. Having Him in my life represents being accepted by God."

Married and a mother to an 11-year-old daughter, Sabrina lives a full and organized life, blessed with joy as she sees her family flourish. The Altar, for Sabrina, is a sacred place where she knows she can connect with God. "For me, the Altar represents surrender, sacrifice, and where I know that I am with God, guarded and protected," she says.

Through her participation in the campaign of faith, Sabrina experienced a complete transformation. It was through this act of unconditional surrender that she found the peace and fulfillment that had eluded her for so long.

Today, Sabrina's life reflects the power of faith and the presence of the Holy Spirit, which has given her everything she once sought in all the wrong places.

Pedro Lopes shares the story of his inner turmoil and the journey that led him to find peace and purpose through faith. Born and raised in a Christian home, Pedro's life took a drastic turn when he was 11 years old. "I grew up learning that I should say 'no' to many things, and that required sacrifice. But on the other hand, if I lived 'in the world,' I wouldn't have to make any sacrifices, and I could do whatever I wanted. So, I decided to get to know the world and say 'yes' to it," Pedro recalls.

He began to sneak around behind his family's back, getting involved with bad influences, lying, and discovering pornography. Despite this, he continued to attend church, although he felt a deep internal conflict. "I knew my true spiritual condition, and that if I died, my soul's destiny would be hell. That scared me, but I didn't want to give up my life of sin," he admits.

Pedro's inner struggle intensified as he thought that by pleasing the devil, he could avoid suffering in hell. This belief led him to become more rebellious and destructive. "I became an extremely nervous teenager. I caused a lot of fights at home, played my family against each other, and caused problems at school. At 14, I started drinking and smoking marijuana," he says. The emptiness inside him grew, and he would lock himself in his room, crying for no reason.

His situation reached rock bottom after the end of a relationship at 17. "I felt lost, which led to depression. I began to feel suicidal, could only sleep with medication, and I was anxious. An inferiority complex developed, and the emptiness grew bigger every day,"



he reflects.

Turning point

Amid the despair, Pedro finally accepted an invitation he had always rejected to join a Youth Power Group meeting. "That was when I decided to surrender to the Truth. I abandoned all those friendships, addictions, and the places I frequented. I focused only on pleasing God," he says.

A week later, Pedro was baptized in water and realized that without the Presence of God in his life, he would not be able to resist the temptations of the world. After receiving the Holy Spirit, everything changed. "Today I am truly happy. I am certain of my Salvation, and this gives me peace, knowing I am who I am and have embraced my faith. God has given me the privilege of serving Him and sharing with others what He has given me," Pedro concludes.

His life, once filled with emptiness and pain, was now filled with purpose, peace, and a deep connection to God.

Think about it—every servant of the Most High faced trials. No one was exempt. Abraham had to leave everything familiar and trust God to lead him to an unknown land. Isaac had to trust God's provision when things seemed impossible.

Jacob wrestled with God, not just physically but spiritually, until he received his blessing. Joseph endured betrayal, slavery, and false accusations before he rose to power and fulfilled God's plan. Moses faced rejection, led a stubborn people, and stood firm against the might of Pharaoh.

Even the apostles endured trials—beatings, imprisonment, and death for preaching the Gospel. And then there's the ultimate example: Jesus. He didn't just face opposition; He took on the sins of the entire world and endured the cross.

None of them were tested by competing with others for approval. Instead, they were tested in their faith, perseverance, and obedience to God, often risking everything, even their lives.

And let's be honest—most people would say, "That's crazy!" But stop and think about it. How many people risk their lives, their freedom, and their futures for things that are meaningless or even harmful?

People lose their lives over pride, bad decisions, or trying to impress the wrong crowd. If people are willing to sacrifice for the wrong reasons, shouldn't we be willing to sacrifice for what's eternal?

Jesus put it plainly when He said:

"

If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. Matthew 16.24

That's the truth. Every promise about the Kingdom of Heaven comes with a test. It's not handed to us on a silver platter. It's something we have to work for, something that tests our character, our faith, and our determination.

Think about your own life—how many times have you had to prove yourself to someone? Maybe it was to fit in with a group, gain someone's approval in a relationship, or earn a job.

From the moment we're born, life is full of tests. As babies, we had to learn to crawl before we could walk. Later, we had to learn to speak, to eat without help, to read, and to write.

Then came learning to drive, holding down a job, or even just managing our daily responsibilities. Every stage of Every day the UBB has a new life pushes us in new ways, and each test is a stepping episode for you. stone to growth.

Here's the key: the tests you're facing aren't meant to There is something for everyone! Do crush you-they're meant to build you up. They're opportunities for growth, for strengthening your faith, and for preparing you for what's next.


But it's up to you. You have a choice. Will you let the tests defeat you, or will you rise to the challenge and be approved?

From a gang life to a new creation

At one point in my life, I was consumed by violence and darkness. The person I once called my leader became my victim—I ended his life with more than 100 bullets. It was then that someone said something that struck me deeply: "I don't see you; I see the devil in you."

Despite that moment of clarity, I continued my path of destruction and rose to be come the leader of the gang. With that role came even more chaos. I was sought by the police, and eventually, I was arrested during a setup in one of the territories I controlled.

I was sentenced to 78 years in prison and spent 15 years in solitary confinement. During my time in prison, the Universal



Church's prison ministry, Universal Beyond Bars (UBB), began its work there. At first, I simply listened, but something about the Word and the preaching resonated with me. In 2012, I decided to be baptized in water, believing it would be the start of my transformation. A desire to help others grew within me. I became



an "assistant" in the prison ministry, mentoring others and supporting them in their faith journey. One of the young men I helped introduced me to his mother, who would later become my wife.

After 15 years, I was released from prison on December 15th. I thought my life would change for the better, but I was wrong. I fell back into the trap of drugs, realizing that the transformation I thought I had experienced in prison was superficial—it was all a facade.



My addiction deepened, and I lived in hypocrisy. My wife encouraged me to return to God, but I lashed out, even assaulting her in a fit of rage. I destroyed her face, and our relationship fell apart.

After our separation, I sank even deeper into addiction. Despite everything, my wife remained steadfast in her faith. She contacted UBB to visit me at home, and a pastor came to pray for me.

After that prayer, it was as if the mind of Christ began to work within me. Drugs lost their appeal, and when I tried to use them, I felt nothing but emptiness. On May 16th, I walked into the Universal Church.


The pastor preached a word that pierced my heart:

"Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old things have passed away behold all things have become new." 2 Corinthians 5:17 That verse kept ringing in my mind. When I returned home, the drugs were still there, but I made a decision: I would never use them again. Yet, I knew something was still missing—



true repentance and genuine conversion. I realized my previous baptism in prison wasn't genuine. This time, I came to the altar determined. When I was baptized again, I left the waters with a firm resolve to live a new life. A thirst for God began to grow within me.

During the Campaign of Israel, I felt God speaking to me. I no longer wanted to pretend or live a double life. I made my sacrifice and asked God for only one thing: His Spirit. Not long after, I attended a special service. That day, I told God, "I cannot leave the same. I need Your Spirit!" During that meeting, the Holy Spirit came upon me. My life has never been the same since. Today, I can say with all the strength of my soul that He lives in me. The Word of God has been fulfilled in my life: the old things have passed away, and everything has truly become new.

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

Jose Silva, now 41, reflects on his tumultuous journey from addiction and crime to finding peace through faith. He grew up in a challenging environment after his parents separated when he was just 2 years old. "My mother and I moved in with a relative. She worked hard to save enough money to rent a small place with two rooms, and the bathroom was outside. By the time I was 8, I was already going to school alone," Jose recalls.

As a child, Jose noticed the absence of a father figure. "I started noticing how much I needed the presence of a father," he shares. At 11, his life took a turn when he was introduced to drugs by peers at school. "First marijuana, then cocaine and alcohol. At
