

To find true happiness, you first need to take hold of life. The dead—spiritually speaking have no claim to happiness. As long as someone remains spiritually dead in their sins, happiness is out of reach. They first need to be brought back to life. And that kind of resurrection only comes through the One who gives life—God.

Jesus said: "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live." - John 11:25. But belief here means more than just words—it's about surrendering your entire self: body, soul, and spirit. When someone makes that full surrender to God, they receive true life. And only then do they gain the right to experience the happiness they've long dreamed of.

As Proverbs 22:4 says: "The reward for humility and fear of the Lord is riches and honor and life." In other words: those who are humble enough to submit to God will be blessed with happinessright here on Earth.



I used to be a deeply sad person. For years, I carried resentment toward my parents because I wasn't raised by them. That left a void inside me-a heavy emptiness that I tried to fill in every possible way. I turned to alcohol, promiscuity, drugs, and even friendships, hoping something would make me feel whole. But nothing ever did. The emptiness remained. I felt completely alone, without peace.

At one point, I even started carrying a gun, thinking it would give me a sense of power or control—maybe even help me feel secure. But that didn't work either. Nothing I tried gave me

To make things worse, I started having serious health issues. I went to doctors, but they couldn't find a solution. Feeling hopeless, I began having suicidal thoughts. That's when I reached out to my sister and opened up about what I was going through. She lives in another country, but she told me about the Universal Church. So, I went. It was a Wednesday, and I showed up outside of service hours. Someone there told me the times of the meetings, but honestly, I didn't want to stay-I just wanted the oil. Still, something made me come back. That Friday, I attended a meeting. And in that service, God spoke to me. He showed me that He didn't just want to heal me—He wanted to change

> From that moment on, I decided to keep going. The more I returned and put into practice what I was learning, the more I began to change. I forgave my parents. I broke free from my addictions. Today, I'm a completely different person. I have peace. I no longer feel alone, because I know that God is with me everv step of the way. With Him in my life, I truly lack nothing.

On June 30, 2023, Luis, a construction worker, suffered a sudden cardiorespiratory arrest after what seemed like a normal day with his family. He was clinically dead for 23 minutes. When doctors managed to revive him, they gave the family no hope. In fact, they were told, "Pick out the casket."

But Luis was, and still is, a man of faith—someone who had already beaten cancer back in 2019. Once again, his family turned to their faith. They began to pray and anointed him with consecrated oil, believing in God's power to heal. Forty-five days later, Luis woke up from the coma. Just three days after that, he was discharged from the hospital.

Even though he was still in pain and dealing with the aftereffects, Luis didn't stop seeking God. He began attending services at the Universal Church, participating in healing prayers and putting his faith into action. Over time, he was completely healed—no more pain, no lasting effects. In fact, today he says he's in better health than ever before. — Luis



"Free from depression and suicidal thoughts."



lbert Einstein once said, "Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results."

If that's true, then why do so many people keep repeating the same habits, even when nothing changes? It's like trying to bake a cake with the wrong recipe—no matter how many times you try, it keeps coming out wrong. Yet, you keep using the same recipe. It makes no sense.

A past marked by sadness, addiction, and gunfire

had a troubled childhood. My home was filled with fights, most of them caused by my father's addiction. Seeing him drunk and out of control hurt me deeply. I felt ashamed and angry. Over time, I developed a strong resentment toward him.

At first, this pain only affected my relationship with my dad-but it didn't stop there. Eventually, it



spilled over into my relationship with my brother. Things got so bad that I almost stabbed him once in a heated argument. Someone had to physically hold me back so I wouldn't hurt him.

Looking for peace, I turned to the wrong crowd. Through friends, I was introduced to drugs. It started with cigarettes and weekend drinking at parties. But soon, I was smoking marijuana regularly and using cocaine.

Addiction took hold of my life. I sold the few clothes I owned just to buy drugs. I even committed petty thefts to feed my addiction. From there, I got involved with weapons and drug traffick-

ing. I lived a life I never thought I'd fall into. I was beaten by police more than once.

One early morning, while walking down the street, I got shot-twice. To this day, I still have a bullet fragment lodged in my leg as a reminder of where that life led me.

Everything started to change in 2018.

My brother, who had already started attending the Universal Church, invited me to go with him. I resisted for a long time-my pride kept me away. But eventually, when I looked at my life and saw how far I'd fallen, I said yes.

When I walked into the church, I noticed something different—people were smiling with a genuine joy I didn't recognize. That day, I heard a message that said, "Jesus gives rest to the tired and burdened." That hit me hard, because that's exactly what I was—tired and burdened.

I began attending the services regularly and started a Chain of Prayer for deliverance from addiction. I got baptized in water, and little by little, God transformed me into a new man.

Today, I can say I love my father. I hold no resentment toward him or my brother. The emptiness that once haunted me is completely gone. I finally found peace. Marcelo Pinto

From Extreme Vanity and Emptiness to a True Encounter with God



I attended the Universal Church for over twenty years. During that time, I took part in faith campaigns and even received blessings—especially in my financial life. But the truth is, I never fully surrendered my life to God. I was there physically, but my heart was far away. I carried a deep emptiness inside me that nothing seemed to fill.

Eventually, I completely distanced myself from the church and threw myself into everything the world had

to offer. Even though I was married, I lived like I was single. Vanity completely took over my life. I had plastic surgery, started dressing in flashy, revealing clothes, and spent my nights in clubs and bars—always trying to fill the emptiness I felt inside. My life became a reflection of my vanity and my desperate search for attention.

But the consequences soon followed. Arguments at home became constant. My husband, who no longer recognized the woman he had married, asked for a separation. I began struggling with insomnia and sank into a deep sadness. I was broken.

One sleepless night, I turned on the TV and happened to catch a program from the Universal Church. In that moment, I felt it was God reaching out to me—offering me a second chance. So, I decided to return. But this time, I came back with a different mindset. This time, I chose to surrender completely to God.

I began to understand the importance of receiving the Holy Spirit, and I started to seek Him with all my heart. I'll never forget one prayer where I cried out to God and said, "God, either give me Your Spirit or take me from this world, because I don't want to live like this anymore." And He heard me. That very same day, I received the Holy Spirit. I was born again. The peace and joy I experienced in that moment were unlike anything I had ever felt. It was the happiest day of my life.

From that point forward, I kept seeking God and putting His Word into practice. He began to transform me from the inside out. He restored my marriage, healed me emotionally, and taught me my true worth. Today, I am at peace. I have real joy. I am a new woman. Now I understand that outward beauty fades, but the beauty that comes from God is eternal. To Him, I give all the honor and all the glory. - Merle

Mariana:

"Before I found the Universal Church, I was going through a really tough time. My family was facing a lot of problems, and I felt anxious and overwhelmed. At the same time, my husband, Gustavo, was going through serious financial struggles. Nothing seemed to be going right for him, and it left him feeling deeply sad and insecure. He didn't know how to help me, and I couldn't help him either.

My aunt, who attends the Universal Church, encouraged me to visit and get help there. I went, and from the moment I walked in, I was warmly welcomed. Gustavo:

"At that time, I was deeply unhappy with my life. But I was so discouraged that I couldn't believe anything could help—not even the Universal Church. It all sounded unrealistic to me, so I kept rejecting Mariana's invitations. She kept trying to show me what I was missing, but her constant insistence just pushed me further

away. I ended up isolating myself.

STUCK IN LIFE?

Have you ever felt like your life has come to a standstill—or that you're just... stuck?

Life doesn't always go as planned. Sometimes, a path that once seemed full of promise suddenly comes to a halt. Doors close, opportunities vanish, and dreams start to feel like distant memories. No matter how hard you try, it feels like you take one step forward only to fall two steps back. Feeling stuck can take many forms. Maybe your career didn't unfold the way

you hoped—or maybe it never even got off the ground. Perhaps you're grieving a relationship that ended without closure. Family problems might feel too deep to fix. Your immigration process could be stuck in limbo. That business idea you once believed in might still be sitting on paper, never brought to life. Maybe your health has drained your peace, or you feel spiritually distant—like God is silent. Or maybe... you're just standing at a crossroads, unsure which way to turn.

If any of this sounds familiar, know this: you are not alone.

We all go through seasons when the road ahead seems uncertain. But a blocked path doesn't mean the journey is over. Sometimes, these moments are divine pauses-God's way of calling us to stop relying on our own strength and start trusting in His. As the Word of God says: "And one shall say, 'Heap it up! Heap it up! sther Carolina's long journey ◀ of suffering began in early childhood. At just six years old, she experienced the trauma of sexual abuse by someone close to her family.

"It only happened once, but it was deeply traumatic and triggered a chain of emotional struggles," she recalls. "From that moment on, I became a timid, withdrawn girl." That same year, her pain intensified when her father passed away.

"With the scars of the abuse and the loss of my father, I grew up believing that happiness was impossible. The grief left a wound in my soul that turned into deep anguish-I felt completely abandoned," she says.

Trying to numb the pain

Loneliness and anger weighed heavily on Esther. She searched for ways to soothe her wounded soul, spending time at parties and constantly surrounding herself with friends. By age 14, she had turned to drugs.

"I was too proud to admit I was hurting, so I tried to fix things in my own way. I started with lighter drugs, but before I knew it, I was using crack."

Her addiction spiraled out of control.

"I hit rock bottom when I found myself addicted to crack, walking the streets dirty, not wanting to



shower, just completely lost. I was deeply depressed and even attempted suicide multiple times."

A turning point

After nearly 14 years of suffering, Esther was introduced to the Universal Church at age 20. Skeptical and hopeless, she decided to attend-but not with the intention to change.

"I didn't go there looking for a transformation. I honestly just wanted to discredit the pastor who told me my life could change. But over time, something began to shift. I started learning about God, and Through that decision, Esther eventually, I began to obey."

As she opened her heart to God's Word, Esther discovered something life-changing: the depth of Jesus' sacrifice and the power of His forgiveness.

"I realized that Jesus died on the cross so I could truly live. Even after everything I had done and experienced, He still forgave and loved me. I began to believe in that love."

A new beginning

That revelation led Esther to surrender completely to God.

"I understood that God had never abandoned me-even in the worst moments when I thought no one saw me, He was there. I gave up everything and laid my life on His Altar."

saiah, a father of eight, grew up in a home torn apart by violence, addiction, and deep emotional wounds.

"My house was in ruins," he recalls. "My father was addicted to alcohol and drugs. He would bring his coworkers to our home to get high. He didn't just beat my mother—he stabbed her and, on more than one occasion, tried to kill her. Some scenes from that time still haunt me." Isaiah and his siblings were also frequent victims of their father's rage.

"I was filled with anger. I started lashing out at my father, and when I got older, I even had him arrested. My hatred ran so deep that I considered killing him."

Trying to survive

In an attempt to escape the cycle of poverty and pain, Isaiah began collecting scrap metal.

"We weren't starving, but we relied on donations to survive," he says. "Even though I worked hard to change my circumstances, hatred consumed me. On the inside, I was still a deeply sad person."

A divine encounter

Everything began to change 26 years ago during a simple lunch break.

"I met a man who told me about Jesus. He couldn't read, so I would read the Bible to him, and he would explain it to me. Little by little, the Word of God began to enter my heart and give me strength. That's when I started to believe that my life could actually change." Isaiah eventually accepted an invitation to attend the Universal Church. What he found there completely shifted his perspective.

"At first, I realized I had been unfair to my father. I began to understand that he wasn't just a cruel man—he was a victim of spiritual forces. That understanding allowed me to see him, my mother, and my brothers differently. My thoughts, my reactions, my entire behavior began to change. Through God's Word, I learned what forgiveness, repentance, and true faithfulness are. I became a new Isaiah."

From brokenness to restoration

As his inner life transformed, so did his outer circumstances.

"I learned to put God first in everything. Every morning, the first person I speak to is Him. I ask for His guidance and protection, and with that, I know my day will be blessed."

Isaiah started selling candy at traffic lights.

"It doesn't matter what you do—it matters who you walk with. I chose to walk with God, and He directed every step."


Today, Isaiah's life bears no resemblance to the chaos of his past.


How many times have you changed your

I got involved in criminal activity at a very young age.

There were many times when I had shootouts with the police-people saw me on the news, firing at officers. I went to prison several times, and every time I came out, I was worse than before. There were about eight of us in a group, and we committed a lot of robberies and assaults together-especially bank robberies. Each of us had our specific role, and we planned everything down to the last detail.

Whenever we pulled off a job, we'd split the money, and I was always so excited. I used to think, "Whoa, this is amazing!" We traveled from city to city carrying out robberies and assaults. We'd call the banks pretending to going to do with your freedom be customers so we could find out their schedules. We'd now." I tried to change. I met a scope them out to learn their busiest hours. Most of our girl, she got pregnant, and we robberies were well planned and organized.



But one day, things didn't go as planned-we got caught right inside the bank. We were arrested and sent to prison. That time, I stayed in for about eight months. But even while I was in prison, we were planning how to do things better once we got out. When I was released, I lived on the streets for about three months, but I hadn't changed. In fact, I was worse. I committed more assaults, got caught again, and went back to prison-this time with my cousin.

While we were locked up, my cousin was murdered. I stayed there for about six months, and even then, I was still causing trouble inside. I was angry, frustrated—I lost One day, the leader of our my mind.

My mom saw what I was going through, and she suffered a lot because of me. I got transferred to three different beat him, drove to a remote prisons, and each time, I kept causing problems.

After I completed my sentence, I went to live with another escaped. My mother-in-law something powerful: God cousin. He told me, "I want to see what you're really saw the life I was living. She didn't look at my past. Even



had a daughter. But I was still in the criminal world. That was my reality.

Every time I left the house, I told my wife I was going to work-but I wasn't. I was going out to commit more robberies and assaults. The truth is, I didn't even need



the money. I wasn't lacking anything. But the desire for more kept pulling me back in.

group called us to carry out a major assault. We kidnapped a man, threw him into the van, location, killed him, and then

invited my wife and me to go to the Universal Church. I told her, "That church is just full of thieves."

Which was ironic—because I was a thief myself. My wife kept insisting, so I finally agreed to go. On the way to the church, I had drugs in my car-cocaine and more. But when I left that service, something changed. I lost the desire to deal drugs. My mind felt different. My thoughts started to shift in a new direction.

I began attending church on Fridays for deliverance. I went on Wednesdays to seek the Holy Spirit. I started going on Sundays. And thank God, today I'm free from addiction. It wasn't easy—but the key was that I made a decision. I chose to leave that life behind.

I've been free for many years now, and I'll never forget the day-October 29, 2015when I was baptized in the Holy Spirit. After being baptized in water, I realized

though I was an evil, corrupt man, God embraced me. He accepted me as His sonsomething I never imagined was possible.

That truth fills me with joy. I am chosen. I belong to Him. God lives inside of me, and I don't owe anything to the justice system. My name is clean.

My family is blessed. We're united. My daughters are blessed. God helped me rebuild my financial life-and today, would you believe it? I own my own business.

Now, I'm an example to my family-my wife, my kids, my brothers and sisters. I used to be someone who had no respect for anyone. But today, people see God's character in me.







From illicit investments to faith-based financial freedom: Zenildo's redemption journey

he first nine years of life were good for Zenildo, now 43, an entrepreneur in the construction sector. However, when his parents separated, his peaceful childhood came to an end. At age 10, Zenildo started working at a car wash, where he had his first exposure to alcohol. By 15, he was experimenting with synthetic drugs, and by 16, he was carrying a weapon and involved in gang activity.

One day, when he came home and found his mother with her new boyfriend, he tried to kill the man. He recalls: "My mother kicked me out not just because of her boyfriend, but because I was hardly home due to my criminal lifestyle."

LIVING ALONE AND FUNDING BUSINESSES THROUGH CRIME

Zenildo lived alone, partying, using drugs, and drinking. He organized events and invested in businesses, such as a tattoo studio and a pizzeria, using money from criminal activities. He reflects: "Even though I was around people, I was truly alone."

It was during this chaotic period that he found out he was going to be a father.

HITTING ROCK BOTTOM

At 25, Zenildo began suffering from anxiety and depression. Around the same time, he developed suicidal thoughts, became paranoid, experienced night terrors, and was unable to sleep. In search of peace, he turned to various religions, but things only worsened.

"At the peak of my breakdown, at 32, I couldn't even be in a crowd without thinking, 'End your life to find peace.' That was the worst point."

It was during those sleepless nights that he discovered a TV program by The Universal Church. "I couldn't sleep, but drinking the blessed water that the pastor prayed over from the TV gave me relief," he recalls.

As he continued watching and praying, he came to a realization: "The emptiness I felt was the absence of God. I had always partnered with evil. It was time to live for God. I needed to convert, quit everything, and start over."

A LIFE-CHANGING COMMITMENT

Zenildo had always viewed the Church as a serious and sacred place, not something to take lightly. His mother, a regular attendee of the Universal Church, often prayed for him. Despite lingering resentment, he called her and asked to attend a service with her.

Determined to build a relationship with God and obey Him in everything, Zenildo got baptized one week later. "I gave up everything that reminded me of my old life. I purified myself from worldly things and filled myself with what pleased God. When I received Him, I knew He saw me, guided me, and would never leave me," he

says. Having G o d 's p r e s e n c e didn't exempt him from challenges, but gave him peace to face them. At 39, while preparing for volunteer work, he was arrested due to an outstanding legal issue he was unaware of.

He says he remained at peace, knowing he had done nothing wrong. Through prayer, he understood that the arrest was not just to resolve the case, but also to teach him lessons he could later share with others.

He spent 30 days in detention. Even though he was in a notorious gang-affiliated cell, he continued serving Jesus — preaching, counseling inmates, and praying.

A RENEWED LIFE WITH FINANCIAL AND SPIRITUAL CLARITY

Now, ten years into his spiritual journey, Zenildo lives free of addiction, healed from depression and anxiety, and spiritually liberated. He forgave his mother and even moved back in with her. He's engaged and preparing for marriage.

"Staying spiritually connected is what keeps me grounded. We hear many people every day, and sometimes evil speaks through them, trying to mislead us. But the more we stay in the Spirit, asking God for discernment and understanding, the better we can distinguish good from evil and avoid its traps."





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
