

Higor, a 24-year-old freelancer, had lived with a chronic condition called atopic dermatitis since he was six years old. "My family noticed something was wrong when I was a child because I developed severe skin irritation that caused itching and wounds all over my body. It was not hereditary, since no one else in my family had it. We went to both an allergist and a dermatologist and did all the necessary tests.

That's when I was diagnosed with atopic dermatitis, which, according to medicine, is a condition with no cure—only treatment to relieve the symptoms, and the medication must be taken for life."

Higor was introduced to the Universal Church at the age of 18 after accepting an invitation. "When I first attended a service, I noticed something different and began going regularly on Wednesdays and Sundays. But at the time, I did not have a true commitment to God. My only goal was to be healed. I would hear and see testimonies of healing through the use of the blessed water consecrated to God on Sundays, but I was not practicing faith or understanding the power of obeying His Word."



It was only when he fully surrendered his life to God and trusted in His miracle that healing came. "After making a vow with God, I received the answer in seven months. Little by little, the irritation and inflammation on my skin began to disappear."



"I said, that's just water, until..."

At first, I didn't believe the blessed water worked. I used to say, "It's just water." But after hearing the pastor encourage us to use our faith with the water, I decided to try. I prayed, "Lord Jesus, You have blessed this water." Then I began to drink it with faith. I needed God to set me free in my heart because I was filled with anger and even had desires to harm someone. Because of that, my blood pressure was very high.

I prayed and forgave the person, just as the Lord Jesus taught. Now I feel so much better. I am happier, and He has touched my heart. My blood pressure has dropped, and the pain in my kidneys is gone. Before, I couldn't even exercise, but now I can go for walks and work out, and I feel great.



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How Mike escaped the grip of crack

t 25, businessman Mike began using ecstasy on weekends. But over time, the drug stopped having any effect, and he turned to cocaine. "Eventually, I lost control. What had been just a weekend habit became part of my daily routine, just to feel a little relief," he recalls.

ike says he tried to maintain a normal social life, but the addiction slowly took over his mind, and living peacefully was no longer possible. "Things got worse when I

smoked crack mixed with cigarettes. That wasn't enough, so I started using pure crack," he admits.

The addiction soon began destroying every part of his life. At work, he started missing four or five

days in a row, which led to his dismissal. "By then, I already felt worthless as a person, but I couldn't stop. I blew my entire severance package on hotels and drugs," he remembers.

Ashamed of his family and convinced he had hit rock bottom, Mike chose to live on the streets. He believed death was his only future. "I

was in a pitiful state, but I still kept using drugs because I thought that was how it would all end. I used constantly, and to keep feeding the addiction, I even started stealing small things," he says.

He remained trapped in addiction for nearly two decades, and his family suffered alongside him. His sister, 38-year-old Neuma Santos, remembers it as a time of deep pain. "My brother was always hardworking, but we noticed he stopped taking care of himself. He was distant, absent. Then one day, I found a vial of drugs among his things and was in shock," she says.

As time went on, his condition only grew worse. He disappeared for days at a time, leaving the family panicked and fearing the worst. "He even stole my mom's and brother's bank cards to keep using. He had lost all control, and we were sinking with him," Neuma explains.

Watching him destroy himself was



unbearable. "He came home many times dirty, injured, and smelling terrible. It broke me emotionally. I had nightmares where I saw him dead. I'd wake up in tears and realize my mother was crying too," she recalls.

I felt worthless as a person, I was ashamed of my family and chose to live on the streets

Mike lived on the streets for three months. One day, he nearly overdosed. Alone and on the verge of death, he cried out to God. "I felt like my soul was leaving body. I begged God to give me one more chance. When I came back, I went straight

to a Universal church. I was so high I don't even remember how I got there. It was a Sunday, during a service for Addiction Recovery," he recounts.

That day, he says, he realized the root of his problem and surrendered his life to God. From then on, everything began to change. "I started doing a chain of prayer for my total deliverance every Friday. The more I went to church, the stronger I became, and I realized I didn't need the drugs anymore. Through faith, I was healed and set free. The Holy Spirit gave me a new direction in life. Today I have peace, joy, and happiness. I've even been able to reclaim dreams that drugs had stolen from me," says Mike, now 44.

His family noticed the transformation immediately. "Seeing him rebuild his life has been a blessing for all of us," says Neuma. "Today, for the honor and glory of God, he helps people who are going through what he once went through."

A witchcraft was done to end her life



Claudia Zavala suffered from repeated attacks of jealousy from people who wanted to harm her. It all began the day she ate a plate of food that had been cursed.

"I was invited to dinner at someone's house and was given a plate of food that had been cursed. I could sense something was wrong, but I couldn't pinpoint what it was at the time. After eating that food, I started having health problems, and my condition quickly began to deteriorate."

"The attack was clearly meant to kill me. I began to suffer from intense bleeding that sometimes lasted for a full week, leaving me extremely weak. I lost the will to get out of bed. My spirits hit rock bottom because of the pain that tore at me inside. When I went to the doctor, I was told I had fibroids and that they might have to remove my womb."

"I was referred to people who claimed to do healings and invocations, spiritualists who performed rituals and made many promises. But instead of getting better, my health became worse. I lost a lot of money paying for these consultations. Evil began to torment my thoughts as well. I felt hunted by a dark presence that whispered in my ears, 'Kill yourself,' and, 'No one loves you.' It even told me to take my own life along with my children."

Claudia sank deeper into despair. She locked herself in her dark room with the windows shut, refusing to eat or even care for herself. Hopelessness drove her to consider suicide as a way out of all the misery she was facing. One night, while trying to distract herself and escape her thoughts, she stumbled across a program from The Universal Church on

"I saw the church on TV one night, and suddenly hope sparked inside me. During the program, the pastor invited viewers to come to the church, to the Temple of Miracles. I accepted the invitation and decided to go. From the very first day I stepped inside, I knew I had found the place where I could start over and build a new life. I had never felt what I felt that day—God received me. I had an encounter with Him and I found hope."

"I began participating in the chain of prayer for my deliverance. God set me free from the witchcraft that was done against me and restored my health. Even the doctors were surprised. The fibroids disappeared, and the bleeding stopped without surgery or the removal of my uterus. Today, I am completely healthy. I also received the Holy Spirit. God healed me both physically and spiritually."

"Envy ended my relationship"



Beatriz Hernández got married at just 17 years old. Her dream was to start a family and live a happy life, but personal problems with a relative soon threatened to destroy those dreams.

"I found evidence of witchcraft in my home. It was done using personal items that belonged to me and my husband—our photos and even our clothing were used in the ritual. Not long after, I started feeling unwell and began experiencing serious problems in my marriage. Later, I found out that the person behind the witchcraft had done it with the intention of destroying my dream of having a family, separating me from my husband, and driving me insane.

My marriage eventually fell apart, and I just wasn't myself anymore. People began to believe I was losing my mind. I started hanging out with the wrong crowd, spending time in nightclubs, and even exposing myself

to prostitution. I tried to fill the emptiness inside me by dating different men. I felt worthless and disgusted with myself. Depression took over, and I even thought about ending my life because I believed it had no meaning anymore.

My ex-husband took custody of our children because of my behavior. That was the moment I hit rock bottom. I felt I had lost everything, even my value as a person."

It was during this dark time that a friend invited Beatriz to The Universal Church.

"I went on a Friday, and for the first time I came into contact with the Word of God. After listening to the sermon, I felt free from the weight that had been crushing me. Something inside me changed that day. I decided to keep attending and began a chain of prayer for my deliverance."

"Today, I am free. I'm no longer depressed. I am happily married to a man of God, and our marriage is more than I ever dreamed of. I also regained the love of my children, rebuilt our relationship, and I am present in their lives. The days of living aimlessly, far from God, are gone. Now I am strong and I entrust my life and happiness to the protection of the Holy Spirit."


Cutting off the problems root cause Deliverance means being set free from what oppresses, steals peace and joy, and blocks growth in every area of life. A person can be physically imprisoned, like in jail, or symbolically, by debt or an abusive relationship. But the worst prison is the internal one. On the outside, someone may look free, yet inside their soul feels suffocated. This inner struggle eventually spills over into external problems. You may have tried to escape your suffering without success. Do you know why? Because some situations demand a stronger power to be defeated.

That is why Fridays at the Universal Church are dedicated to helping people experience spiritual deliverance. Deliverance becomes clear when someone notices things happening in their life without explanation, as if they are fighting against an invisible force. In these services, you will learn how to cut off the root cause of your problems through strong prayers and how to overcome them once and for all.

To understand the importance of these meetings, consider this: every life is a territory disputed by two kingdoms—God's and the kingdom of evil. Spiritual freedom happens when God's kingdom expels darkness and takes control of that territory. This is the first step to a new life with Him. First, a person is freed from evil, and then they can grow in a relationship with God, receiving His Spirit to dwell within them.

"I just wanted some peace."

Behind Evellyn Sereno's smile is a story of pain, trauma, and a turning point. Her childhood was anything but easy.

"I grew up surrounded by my parents fighting, blood on the floor, and hateful words carved into the walls with knives," she recalls.

As a teenager, the effects of that broken home led her down dangerous paths. At fourteen, Evellyn entered an abusive relationship.

"I even started looking for drugs with my boyfriend at the time so we could resell them," she says.

At seventeen, she became pregnant and decided to marry him, but her plans quickly unraveled.

"Two days before the wedding, I found out he had cheated on me and gotten another girl pregnant. My world collapsed, but I still went through with the wedding because I was emotionally dependent," she explains.

Marriage turned out to be a prison. Isolation, arguments, and disappointment forced Evellyn to move back in with her parents. There, she faced old wounds and even deeper rejection, only this time while

holding her baby daughter. The accusations, arguments, and humiliations pushed her into an emotional breakdown.

"I just wanted some peace," she remembers.

Escaping reality

Trying to numb the pain, she threw herself into partying, drinking, and short-lived relationships.

"I came home even more empty. I stopped sleeping, stopped eating, and cried nonstop because of depression. I lost my job and had constant suicidal thoughts."

Exhausted and hopeless, she longed for peace. In 2018, during this desperate search, she remembered the Universal Church she had once attended with her father. She decided to go to a service but ended up sleeping through most of it. At the end, a young woman encouraged her to return.

"She told me that God would give me a chance to start over."

A new beginning

Days later, Evellyn prayed a bold prayer. "God, if you really exist, if everything they say about you is true, I'll go to church. But if nothing changes, I'll never come back."




That day, the pastor spoke about a situation that felt exactly like hers. Evellyn went to the altar, poured out her heart, and cried as if her soul was being cleansed. For the first time in her life, she felt relief and peace.

"It was like God lifted a ton off my chest." Through her journey of deliverance, she learned to forgive both herself and those who hurt her. "I realized what I needed most was Jesus," she says. Later, during a campaign of faith, she experienced what she calls the most powerful moment of her life.

"I received the Holy Spirit and the conviction that God is with me."

Today, Evellyn serves as a volunteer at the church. She is married to a man of faith who embraced her first daughter as his own, and together they have another child. "Everything changed when I put God first. He added everything else to my life," she says with a smile.

From Brokenness to a New Beginning

I magine growing up with everything you need, never worrying about food or where you would sleep at night. That was my life until my parents divorced. That is when everything changed. Suddenly, survival became a daily struggle.

We moved into a neighborhood full of drugs, crime, and violence. I felt lost. I did not understand what was happening around me, and I did not know how to adapt to this new reality.

Life became tough. I went from living in a place where people treated you kindly to a place where you had to fight just to keep what you had. My world flipped upside down. I started stealing cars. I knew it was wrong, but at the time, it felt like the only way to make money.

My mom was hardly ever home, so no one knew what I was doing. From stealing cars, I moved on to selling drugs and spending most of my time in the streets.

By the time I was 15 or 16, I was already getting arrested. Jail became routine, and eventually, I ended up in prison more than once. My life was



falling apart. I did not want to live that way anymore. I did not want to be feared or labeled a criminal, but I did not feel strong enough to leave it behind either.

Deep down, I was miserable. Money came and went. I had no control over my life. Even the women I was with claimed they loved me, but they betrayed me. My life was a mess.

One day, a friend invited me to a UBB service. Honestly, I went with a critical mindset. I mocked everything. During the service, I was not even paying attention.

I was planning my next move on the streets, thinking about the next car to steal or the next deal to make. But little by little, something started changing. I kept going back. I joined the chain of prayer and decided to obey, even though I still had doubts. That is when I began to notice God transforming my heart and mind.

I heard about the Holy Spirit, and something inside me said, "That is what I need." I spoke to the pastor, and he explained that with the Holy Spirit, God would be with me every day of my life. I made the choice to leave my old life behind completely.

Then, on a Wednesday, I received the Holy Spirit. That day, everything changed. My thoughts, my character, my reactions—everything was different. Before, I would have exploded in anger or even turned violent. But now, I had peace. Here is what I want you to know:

When you receive the Spirit of God, you truly



become a new person. Without Him, it is nearly impossible to stay on the right path.

But with the Holy Spirit, He gives you strength to overcome anything and peace that this world cannot give. Only through Him can you be truly free. – Mr. Anthony

What can I do to stop evil in my life?

How can you stay strong and protected

- Choose your circle wisely. The people around you can pull you down or lift you up. If someone is living in darkness, chances are it will affect you too.
- Be careful in relationships. If you want peace, don't tie yourself to someone who thrives in chaos. The Bible says light and darkness don't mix.
- Walk away from shady situations. If something doesn't feel right, don't test it. Don't play with fire.
- Stay close to God. The Bible calls it "dwelling in the shelter of the Most High." That means keeping a daily connection with Him. He protects those who remain near Him.
- Pray and stay alert. Jesus taught us to pray, "Deliver us from evil." That's more than words—it's a lifeline. Prayer and obedience are your strongest weapons against the enemy.

You can overcome evil

No, we can't erase evil from the world. But we can choose not to let it control us. When you choose God and walk in faith—even if you've failed before—He gives you strength to resist temptation, stay steady, and move forward with peace.

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












oping for a more comfortable encouraged to return. life and better opportunities, 54-year-old Joseph Arnold left The pain and the turning point his hometown determined to start fresh. But his expectations were quickly shattered. Without formal education or a clear profession, he found work in construction.

Since he had nowhere to live, Joseph stayed at the construction site, sharing the space with rats and fleas for three long months. "I cried many nights. Even though life back home was simple, at least I had comfort there," he recalls.

Little by little, his situation improved, but the emptiness inside him remained. Believing that companionship would fill the void, he entered a relationship and moved in with his partner. Unfortunately, things only got worse, with constant arguments that often turned violent.

How can you lose what you don't have?

During that time of struggle, Joseph often passed by a Universal Church near his home. Members would invite him for prayer and services, but he always refused.

One day, however, he realized something: his fear of "losing" didn't make sense, because he truly had nothing to lose. That day, he decided to step into the Universal Church. There, he was warmly welcomed and

Just eight days after his first visit, tragedy struck. On the way to another service with his daughter, she was hit by a car during an illegal street race and died instantly.

The loss devastated him. M"I was desperate. It was the lowest point of my life, and all I wanted was to kill the man who caused me that pain. But then I remembered what I had heard about Jesus. I decided to surrender my life and those feelings of revenge to Him," Joseph explains.

Now he has something truly valuable By giving his life to God, Joseph's heart was transformed. The anger and grief were replaced with peace. He received the

Holy Spirit, and both his life and family were restored.

"Through the Holy Spirit, I found peace and joy. I overcame my past, my failures, and the pain of loss. Even though I don't have an education, I built a new life. Today, I run my own business, and through obedience, God has blessed my family," he concludes.



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
