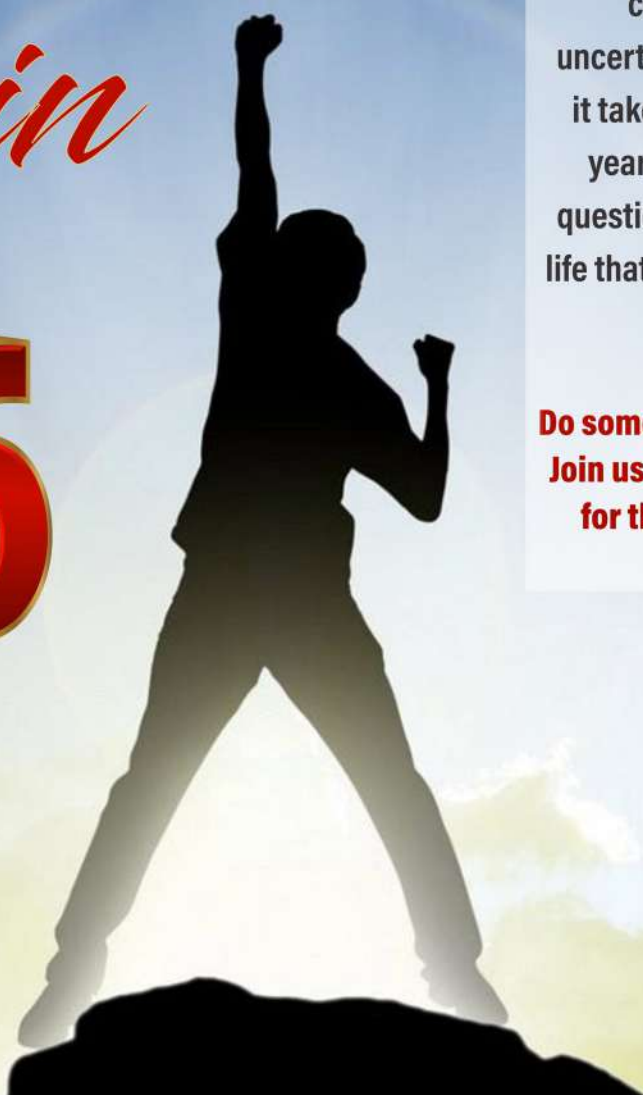

Fireworks fade, but reality remains

Real estate agent Simone Nakama, 42, remembers the traditions she followed in the past during New Year's celebrations. "I wore new clothes, but they were always donated later. I chose colors based on the area of life I thought needed help because people said colors had meanings. But nothing ever worked. I enjoyed the excitement of fireworks and the food, but within the same week, reality came back with poverty and family fights. Nothing changed, only the date on the calendar. In fact, everything got worse," she says.

She recalls a life marked by pain. "My stepfather used to beat me and, when drunk, threatened to kill us. I slept with a knife under my pillow. We ended up living in a tenement, in a basement under a bar, sharing one bathroom with 20 families. Many times, our main food was just cornmeal."

From a young age, Simone lived with depression. "From 20 to 24, I locked myself inside the house. Later, I entered a relationship and seemed to improve, but after pregnancy, I developed postpartum depression. There was

always a reason for my condition. First, it was my father's death, then something else. Depression followed me through every stage of life," she says.

Already taking strong prescription medications, her condition only worsened. "I could not sleep, so I took sleeping pills. Then I took medication to stay awake, and later medication to feel happy, but nothing worked. I stopped going to work, stopped showering, stopped taking care of myself, and did not even step into my backyard. Psychologists and psychiatrists only increased the dosage." She lists the consequences. "I attempted suicide by cutting my wrists and drinking cleaning products. I had my stomach pumped after taking pills to kill myself. To my shock, a doctor asked why I had not taken rat poison, since I was just causing trouble."

Each new year arrived, but her depression remained the same. "I spent New Year's nights locked



inside the house, depressed and crying. I heard the fireworks and felt angry because I was not happy. I spent New Year's Eve taking medication and hiding under a blanket."

Five years ago, everything changed. "I

knew the Universal Church but had drifted away. I returned in 2016, right at the end of the year. I placed all my expectations and desires on the altar because I had nothing left to lose, and I knew everything would be different. When I received the Holy Spirit, the depressed and insecure Simone no longer existed."

Today, she celebrates a new life. "I no longer have depression. I am complete. Before, I was just surviving, but now the Holy Spirit is the reason I live. Today, my daughters and I serve God, and our priority is to begin the new year in His presence," she concludes.

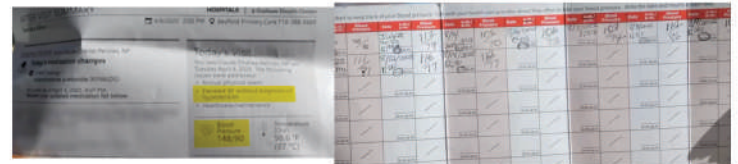
“I used too have high blood pressure.”

After my sister passed away, I became depressed. From that time on, I realized that I was having high blood pressure every time I went for a checkup. When I came to this ministry, I started drinking the blessed water. I decided on my own to stop taking the medication. When I went back to the doctor for another checkup, I found out that my blood pressure was normal. I also could not sleep at night before, but now I sleep very well.



From that moment on, I began bringing the blessed water from the church to my mother regularly. She held on to her faith and made a firm decision that she no longer had cancer. Little by little, the cancer shrank and eventually disappeared. When my mother went in to begin chemotherapy, the doctor told us something we never expected to hear. He said she was free from cancer and that there was nothing there. I thank God for everything He has done. Ms. Annet

A new beginning on New Year's Eve

My mother served spirits, and every year, as the year came to an end, we would go to the beach to perform rituals meant to guarantee a better new year. We followed those rituals faithfully, believing that dancing, offering flowers, perfumes, and gifts to the saints would change our lives. My mother, who was a spiritist, also welcomed many people into our home who were looking for help and a fresh start for the coming year. Even with all that devotion, nothing ever changed.

As the years went by, my life remained empty and troubled. I had no peace inside. I was married, but witchcraft was used to separate us, and I began to suffer deeply. I could not sleep at night, and when I finally did fall asleep, I

was tormented by terrible nightmares. I would wake up suddenly, feeling as if someone were choking me, with my heart racing in fear. Sometimes, I dreamed that I was being buried alive and woke up terrified. My life was full of anguish, yet I continued to remain faithful to the spirits, believing they would eventually help me.

After my ex-husband passed away, I remarried. My new husband knew about the Universal Church, and when he saw the condition I was in, especially the insomnia and constant nightmares, he invited me to go with him. I accepted the invitation, and there I was advised to take part in a chain of prayer for my complete deliverance from everything I was facing.

As I began the chain of prayer, something incredible happened. The nightmares stopped. The insomnia disappeared. I was finally able to sleep peacefully through the night. For the first time in many years, I felt peace and freedom. I continued attending church, and the more I sought God, the more my life began to change for the better. "I felt like a man with no strength or motivation"



For me, the end of the year was anything but happy. We held family parties hoping to be joyful, but something always went wrong. There was always a problem, and I felt an overwhelming desire to disappear. It was hard to explain, but it left me deeply sad and without direction. Year after year, the same suffering continued.

One New Year's Eve, I fought with my wife and separated from her. That same night, after an argument on the street, I grabbed a gun intending to take a young woman's life, and I was arrested. What

should have been a time of celebration became a tragedy. Another year, during a family gathering, an argument broke out and my brother was attacked. I saw him bleeding, in a situation that never should have happened.

When it was not family problems, it was finances. When it was not finances, it was issues with the children. It was always sadness. I felt like a man with no strength or motivation to be a real husband and father. I was married but living like a single man, lying, disappearing, and only coming home the next day. That behavior led my wife into depression.

I smoked four or five cigarettes in a row, full of anguish. I worked, but I never moved forward. Everything I earned was wasted on drinking, smoking, parties, and late nights, which only brought more frustration.

I came to the Universal Church through my wife. I saw the change in her and thought, she is different, and I want that too. I started attending and learned about the New Year's Eve Vigil, about beginning the year in God's presence.

Taking part in that vigil was powerful. I felt a peace I had never known. There was no fighting, no confusion. I realized that if I placed the beginning and the end of my year in God's hands, everything in between could also change. That was the path I had been searching for.

I gave up everything to live for my family and for God. I had tried to fill a void with drugs, alcohol, and nightlife, but nothing worked. What I found in the church was the Holy Spirit. He filled me completely.

Today, I have no addictions. I have peace in my home, peace with my children, and a restored marriage. My wife no longer suffers from depression, and my life has been transformed.

All of this happened through the Holy Spirit I received at the Universal Church of the Kingdom of God. I invite you who feel sad or lost to take part in the New Year's Eve Vigil. Just as there was a solution for my life, there is a solution for yours too.

"My misery continued for years"



My name is Viviane, and for me, the end of the year used to mean fights and arguments. From the age of 13 to 24, I spent every New Year's Eve at the beach with my mother. She served a spiritual entity, and every year we performed rituals. Afterward, she would not let me turn my back to the sea. We had to leave facing the ocean because she said turning away was disrespectful.

My mother always tried to offer the best: imported perfumes,

expensive champagne, and jewelry. Many times, she offered things she would not even buy for herself. Still, no matter how much she believed she was doing the right thing, life inside our home got worse every year. I was the only one who went with her, and we fought constantly. One New Year's Eve, right after leaving the sea, we got into a physical fight on the beach. I threw a champagne glass at her, she slapped me, and then disappeared. What should have been a celebration became a nightmare.

After years of living like that, I was invited to spend New Year's Eve at the Universal Church, and I accepted. As soon as I arrived, I knew that night would be different. I did not feel the heavy burden I used to carry. That night, I experienced peace, something I had never felt before, and it marked my life.

I also heard a word that stayed with me: "I am the Lord your God, and I will sustain you." After that night, God truly turned my life around. What was missing, He provided. That experience made me want to know Him more, until I received the Holy Spirit. That was when everything was complete. I realized He did not just sustain me, He filled me.

The emptiness I carried for years disappeared. The sadness, anger, and pain I had toward my mother were replaced by my greatest treasures today: peace and joy. Now, the best place to be is in the presence of God.

Today, I look forward to New Year's Eve. I begin the year with Him, and I also have the privilege of serving Him on that night. When I serve Holy Communion at the turn of the year, I stop and think about where I was before. I used to be at the sea, serving entities, and I had nothing. Today, I serve a living God who has given me everything.

If you are watching and have been doing the same things I used to do, hoping they will help, do what I did. Give God a chance to speak to you at the turn of the year. Spend New Year's Eve at the Universal Church. I challenge you to take part in the New Year's Eve Vigil. If nothing changes, you do not have to come back. But I am sure it will. Just as God changed my life, He will change yours too.

In his adolescence, Alessandro chose to follow his own path and became involved with bad company, which led him into the world of addiction. "I started using drugs at 14, and every day I got worse: I dropped out of school and plunged into crime. Of ten children, I was the only one to follow the wrong path. I was considered the black sheep of the family. I felt rejected, and that generated resentment in me," he says.

Because he was involved with drugs and crime, Alessandro caused problems for many people, which led to fights among his family members. "To solve the problem, they asked for help from a neighbor who was a police officer, and he would arrest me so I would calm down. I was arrested several times, and that made me very angry because

I was beaten. Every time I saw him, I felt the taste of blood in my mouth from so much hatred," he recounts.

All these accumulated feelings also affected his relationships with others. "I entered into a relationship, had a daughter, and there was a betrayal. She decided to leave home with another person and left me with the child. I was in a desperate situation because I didn't know what to do. This new rejection generated

immense emptiness inside me that prevented me from working and living. I only had thoughts of death," he declares.

While planning his revenge, he received an invitation to visit the Universal Church. "On that same day, I went and freed myself from 22 years of addiction. After three months of attending the meetings, I went to the New Year's Eve Vigil, and during the meeting, a prayer focused on forgiveness was offered. I went to the altar and surrendered everything I felt to Him. On the same day, I met the police officer who had arrested me several times. I hugged him and asked for his forgiveness," he comments.

As time went on, challenges arose, but he was free to face them and could count on God's support. "I got married again, I have a blessed family in God's presence, and I can say that it is very worthwhile to forgive. I have become a living testimony among those who knew me, and today I show everyone what God has done in my life," he concludes.

enormous hatred in me," he states.

Alessandro tried to solve the problems with his own strength, which brought further struggles, including depression: "I was isolated for about three months. I lived in the dark and didn't talk to anyone. I had an

Hugo served as a pastor for ten years, but in 2017, pride overwhelmed him, and his communion with God ceased.

From the altar to drug trafficker

Hugo committed adultery and, as a result, was removed from the ecclesiastical body of the church. He recounts how he reacted: “I didn’t accept help and abandoned God, my ex-wife, my daughter, and went on with my life. Then, I traded the blessing of the Altar for drug trafficking.”

The path from the Altar to crime took only three months. “I started stealing, and since the first few times were successful, I continued. Then, I got into drug trafficking and transported drugs from one city to another,” he explains. During this period, he began a relationship with Mariana, who was also involved in crime. Soon, they moved in together.

A horror movie

In October 2018, Hugo was transporting drugs when police officers were already waiting to arrest him. He recalls: “My reaction was to run away, and then I got into a physical fight, but I couldn’t escape. I was caught red-handed with 35 pounds of marijuana.”

Fear and regret

Behind bars, Hugo was overwhelmed by pain and fear. “I realized the disappointment I had caused my mother. I, who had once taught people about God, was now imprisoned for putting lives at risk,” he says. An unexpected refuge

During a visit, Hugo received prayer from his mother, which gave him the strength to turn back to God. “In the cell, I prayed, I asked for mercy, and at that moment, God answered me. Through a crack in the windows, I looked at the sky and asked for help. Listening to Universal Church programs on the radio, my soul was warmed in that cold cell,” he recalls.

Finally, freedom

In January 2019, at a hearing, Hugo obtained his freedom. His first action upon leaving prison was to go to the Altar, from where he has never left since. “For the change to happen, I left behind the Hugo I was and committed to my marriage before God,” he says.

Hugo and Mariana dedicated the following years to rebuilding their lives under God’s guidance. Hugo recalls the most important moment of his life: “At the New Year’s Eve Vigil, seconds before the start of the year, I received the Spirit of God.”

Today, Hugo and Mariana are entrepreneurs—he works in upholstery, and she in aesthetics. “Although I didn’t deserve it, God restored everything, gave me a marriage, a real family, and a blessed home. Today I don’t have the title of pastor, but I have happiness for being a man full of the Holy Spirit,” he concludes.

Protect your mind!



Before anything else, let me draw your attention to something truly important. Out of everything you may have possessions, memories, knowledge, friendships there is one treasure that must be protected above all else: your mind, what the book of Proverbs calls the heart.

We live in an age of constant information, and because of that, protecting the mind has become one of the greatest challenges we face. Above everything else you guard, your mind must come first, because it is from there that the springs of life flow.

In the book of Proverbs, chapter 4, starting in verse 20, God speaks like a loving Father: “Pay attention to My words Do not let them out of your sight; keep them within your heart.” In other words, God calls us to think, reflect, and reason.

He shows us that His Word should be the first information we take in each day not the news, not social media, not phone notifications but the Bible. Begin your day by placing God’s Word before your eyes. When the Bible is your focus, you gain direction, clarity, and strength to face any battle, even the ones behind bars.

I learned this, I practice it, and I teach it because it works. Those who do it come back saying, “It changed my life.” In Proverbs, the word heart often means the mind, the center of human understanding and decision making. That is why Scripture

says: “Above all else, guard your heart.” Proverbs 4:23. We are surrounded by voices music, conversations, news, messages that influence our thoughts, even when we do not realize it. That is why so many people lose their peace, their health, their faith, and even their families: they allowed harmful things to enter their minds.

You lock your car. You protect your home. You pay for insurance. But many people fail to protect what matters most. Some words stay with us forever. Some thoughts make us sick inside. Some ideas leave us stuck and hopeless.

The Bible teaches that God’s words bring life and healing, while harmful words bring death. Guarding your mind is not optional. It is a matter of spiritual survival.

On December 10th, we started the last 21 days of the year with the Daniel Fast, a fast from useless and harmful information. Maybe you were invited to join this fast by the UBB volunteers but have not taken it seriously until now.

This fast is not about food. It is about stopping the intake of things that do not build you up spiritually and focusing on what truly strengthens you: the Word of God.

I challenge you to take part in what is left of the Daniel Fast, a mental and spiritual detox, so that this end of the year is not just a change on the calendar, but a true change of mind. You are invited, no matter your religion.

This is about self-care, inner healing, and protecting what no one can take from you: your mind.

I stole from her to support my habit and spiraled deeper into despair.

My life was once consumed by addiction and destruction. I began drinking alcohol at just eleven years old, and that opened the door to drugs such as marijuana, cocaine, and eventually crack.

My addiction became so severe that I experienced hallucinations and even resorted to inhaling diesel fuel just to feel a high. While working as a truck driver, other drivers and I mixed drugs and substances to endure the pressure of the job.

Because of this, I lost many jobs, overturned trucks, and completely destroyed my health. My body deteriorated from constant substance abuse. I became swollen, developed a serious heart condition, and was told I had only four months to live.

At my lowest point, I was arrested for drunk driving after testing four times over the legal alcohol limit.

The case made national news, and I was labeled “the drunkest driver in the country.” Even after returning to live with my mother, my addiction

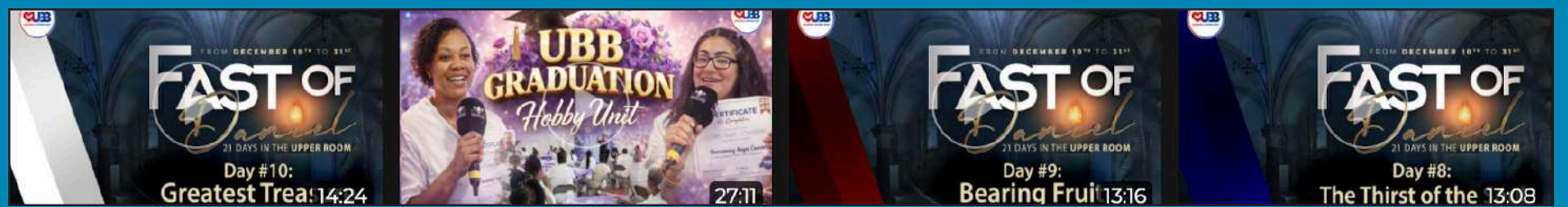
Everything changed after I suffered a heart attack. In that moment, I experienced something I know was real, not a dream, and I cried out to God, begging Him for one more chance at life.

When I woke up, I humbled myself, apologized to my mother, and made the decision to go to church immediately. On December 29, 2019, I surrendered my life to God at the altar, not knowing that my mother and brother had been praying and fasting for me in a campaign of faith.

From that day on, my life was transformed. Through fasting, prayer, and faith, I received strength I could never find on my own. I was delivered from addiction, met my wife in church, and began a completely new life.

Today, I no longer drive trucks. Instead, my wife and I own a coffee shop and a restaurant, we have purchased a home, and we are building a future together.

I share my testimony so that those trapped in addiction can find hope. I believe God saved me so I could help save others, and my life stands as proof of the transforming power of faith and the Holy Spirit.

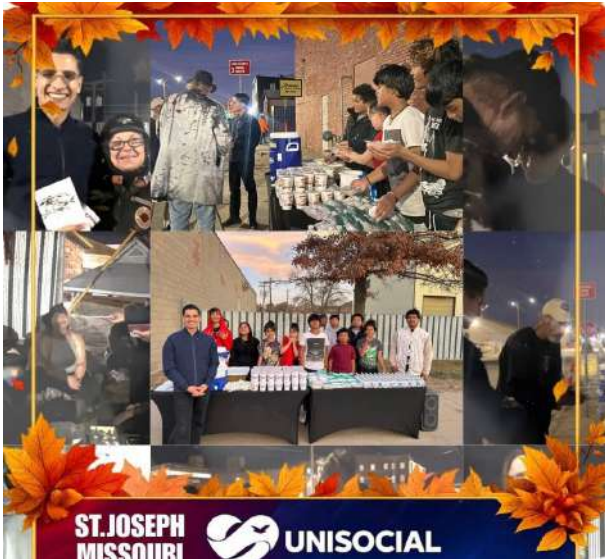

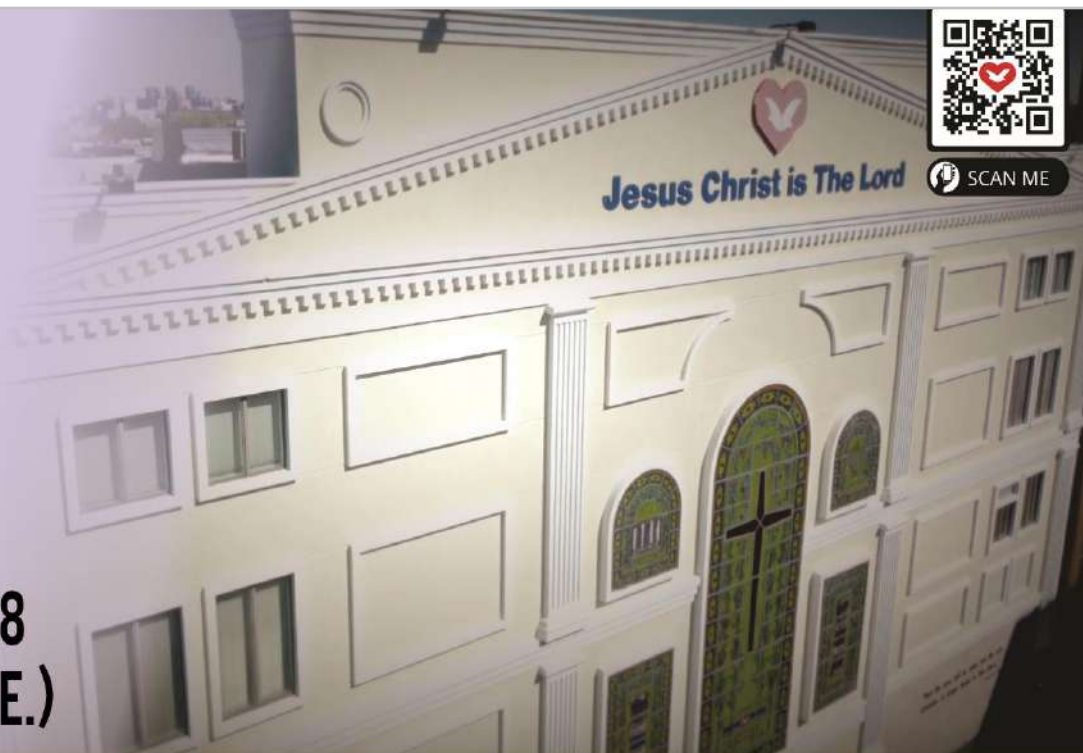
