In this world, all of us get tired at some point. But the real question is this: What are you tired of? Suffering or fighting?

There is a huge difference between these two attitudes.

Those who are tired of suffering may have faced fear. At some point in life, they may have felt so overwhelmed that they wanted to hide. But when they reach their limit, something changes. They decide to take a stand. They face their problems. They confront their fears. And they turn defeat and shame into victory.

This is what Gideon did.

Gideon was called by God to change his life and the life of an entire nation because of his attitude of resistance and faith:

Rafael noticed the first signs of illness when red spots began to appear on his arms.

"Large red spots started showing up on my arms, so I decided to see a doctor. I was told it was just an allergic reaction and was sent home. But my condition got worse. Spots began to appear all over my body. I felt extremely weak, and I started bleeding from my mouth. I even noticed blood in my urine.

I went back to the hospital, and the doctor realized it was not an allergic reaction because the symptoms were abnormal. After a thorough examination, I was diagnosed with leukemia. The doc-

tors could see that it was very advanced and aggressive, although they could not confirm the exact stage at that time. My world fell apart.

They immediately started me on chemotherapy, but they were not sure how my body would respond or if I would respond at all. I was hospitalized for treatment. I remember the doctor speaking with my family and telling them there was a low chance I would survive.

But my wife had already been attending church and praying for me. She made a chain of prayer on Tuesday for my healing and brought me blessed items from the church to the hospital. While I was there, I also watched the church services online and listened to testimonies that encouraged me.

Even though I became very weak, lost all my hair, and saw many people die who were receiving the

same treatment, I stayed strong and kept going because of my faith in God. I refused to accept my condition and held on to the Word and the promises of God.

After some time, my test results started coming back normal, with no signs of the disease. The leukemia disappeared. I had not been on chemotherapy for very long and was already on the list for a bone marrow transplant, but suddenly I began to improve. The doctors could not explain it. From a medical point of view, it should not have been possible. But God performed a miracle."

Vanessa, 41, is a technical analyst. In 2017, her faith was put to the test. During routine annual exams, doctors discovered nodules on the right side of her neck. “It was papillary thyroid cancer, a level 6 malignant tumor. I read the test results by myself before seeing the doctor, and I was devastated. I cried a lot because once you hear the word cancer, it feels like receiving a death sentence,” she says.



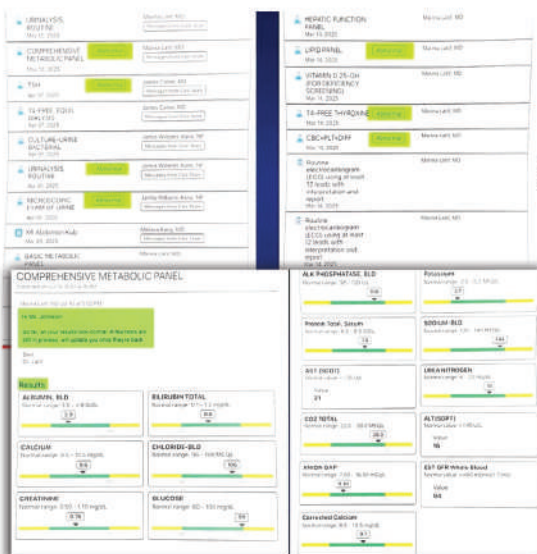
“I had surgery, and when the pathology report came back, it showed that no additional treatment was necessary,” she adds. Vanessa believed she was cured. However, a year later, follow up exams brought unexpected news. New nodules had appeared. “It turned out to be metastasis. Both the ultrasound and the biopsy found another level 6 tumor on the left side of my cervical region,” she explains. “At that point, I decided to rely on my faith again. Using the blessed water, I began to pray that the nodules would disappear.”

I also did not want to go through radioiodine therapy again, which was a possible treatment after surgery,” she recalls.

Then something remarkable happened on the day of the operation. “During the cervical dissection surgery, the biopsy showed that everything was normal. The doctor had planned to inject a radioactive liquid because the nodules were very small and he could not find them. To everyone’s surprise, there was no malignant nodule.”

“My test results are no longer abnormal.”

I used to have many complaints every time I went to the doctor. Most of my blood work always came back abnormal.

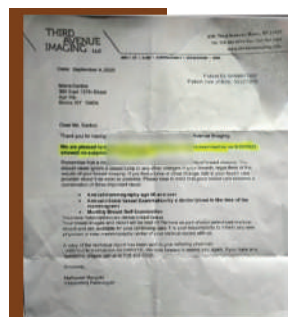


I learned about this ministry while watching the Showdown of Faith. Since I started attending, I have been praying and drinking the blessed water.

Nothing is too hard for God



We all face moments when something feels impossible, so heavy and overwhelming that we cannot see a way forward. In Numbers 11:23, we find a powerful question from God: “Has the Lord’s arm been shortened?” In other words, do you really think there are limits to what I can do? This verse reminds us that what feels impossible to us is never impossible for God.

Think about something simple, like learning how to drive. At first, it feels overwhelming. Your hands grip the steering wheel too tightly, your feet hesitate over the pedals, and every sound makes you nervous. It is hard to believe that one day driving will feel natural, almost automatic. Yet with time and practice, what once felt impossible becomes routine.

That is often how life works with God. We look at our situations, lack, uncertainty, broken relationships, unanswered prayers, and assume they are too complicated or too far gone to be restored. But Numbers 11:23 reminds us that God’s power has no limits. What overwhelms us does not overwhelm Him. Just as we learn to trust the process when learning something new, faith calls us to trust God’s power even when everything looks impossible.

His arm is not too short.

Not for your situation.

Not for your need.

Not for your breakthrough.

The Lord said to Moses, “Has the Lord’s arm been shortened? Now you shall see whether what I say will happen to you or not.” Numbers 11:23

May the God of the Bible bless you.

“I thought I was already dead inside until God gave me a new life.”

My name is Andreia. I am 50 years old, and for 28 years of my life, I suffered from depression.

My pain did not begin in adulthood. It started when I was only six years old. My mother was 47 when I was born, and people often said she looked like my grandmother. Those comments hurt me deeply. I grew up feeling different and out of place. My siblings already had their own lives and routines, and I felt like there was no space for me. We were twelve children. Today, only seven of us are still alive.

I became a very isolated child. I felt ashamed to talk to people, so I kept everything locked inside.

As a teenager, things got worse. My father, who was my hero, suffered a stroke and remained bedridden for five years. That completely broke me emotionally. Around that time, I started drinking. Alcohol became my escape. When I drank, I would say my name was Vanessa, because I truly became another person. It felt like Andreia no longer existed.

In my adult years, I went through something even more painful. One night, while I was drinking, I was abused. From that situation, a relationship developed. Later, I found out the man I was with was involved in crime, but by then I was already emotionally dependent. I stayed with him for almost three years and ended up getting involved in things I should not have. I sank deeper and deeper into that life.

At one point, I betrayed him. When he found out, he wanted to kill me. He took me to a remote place with that intention, but he did not go through with it. I never told anyone what I was living through. Instead, I drank even more, trying to numb the pain.

Later, I was in a serious car accident. My left arm was badly injured, it became shrunk, and I needed surgery to place a metal plate with five pins. The doctors said my arm would never return to normal. That news pushed me even further into depression. I was taking strong medication, suffered from constant headaches, and could not sleep. I spent many nights wide awake.

I felt an emptiness that nothing could fill. I started seeing shadows and hearing voices telling me to throw myself off my apartment balcony. I lived alone at the time. I would lock myself in a dark room, afraid of my own thoughts.

I felt completely alone. I could not count on my family or on the people I called friends. The desire to die grew stronger each day. I even wrote a farewell letter saying there would be no funeral or wake because I was already dead, I just



needed to make it official.

But I did not end my life.

One day, while watching television, a program from the Universal Church came on. I heard a man talking about a situation exactly like mine. He said there was a way out. It took time, but I decided to go to the Universal Church. From the first day I went, it felt like I saw a light. That night, I was finally able to sleep.

Even after I started attending church, I still had many doubts. I did not fully believe. It took me four years to truly understand what faith and obedience meant. I realized I needed to change my

life for real.

My deliverance was not easy. Because of my past, I did not believe God could forgive me. But I understood something important. I wanted God, and He wanted me. That was enough to begin. Little by little, everything started to change. My arm recovered. I was freed from addictions, pain, and inner conflicts. When I had a true encounter with God, I killed Vanessa. I left that old life behind and surrendered myself completely.

During the Daniel Fast, I received the Holy Spirit, and that was the greatest moment of my life. It felt like being born again. The sadness, the destructive thoughts, the habit of blaming others, and the emotional instability were all left in the past.

Today, I help my family. By God’s grace, I have become an example. I got married, and I have a new life. I still face struggles, but now it is different. I can face problems without letting them destroy me inside. There is a divine strength within me.

I know with all my heart that without the Holy Spirit, none of this would be possible. He is everything to me. Without Him, life has no meaning.

He thought his life was over



Years of struggles with drugs, alcohol, and gambling led Guilherme, 39, to lose his first marriage. His

addictions controlled his life and eventually drove him to the point of trying to take his own life. But through God, he received a second chance.

"I was addicted to marijuana, cocaine, alcohol, and even gambling. These addictions destroyed my marriage. Year after year, instead of getting better, I only got worse. The deeper I went into my addictions, the more I pushed away the person who loved me. I became very aggressive and verbally abusive. I remember my wife begging me to change, warning that one day she would leave. I did not listen, and that is exactly what happened. One day I came home, and she was gone.

When my marriage ended, I fell into deep depression. It became so intense that I started planning my suicide. I remember telling myself, 'In 24 hours, I am going to take my life.' While flipping through television channels, I came across the Universal Church program. The testimonies immediately caught my attention. I saw people whose lives and marriages were even worse than mine, yet they had been transformed and restored. I saw that as my opportunity, and

I decided to go to church.

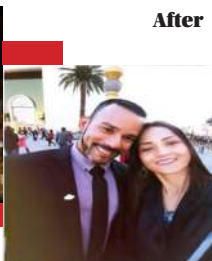
When I arrived, I realized I needed inner healing. I let go of the baggage from my past, abandoned my addictions, and stopped doing what was wrong. I decided to turn my life around. I listened, obeyed, and put into practice everything I learned. After my encounter with God, I became a new man. My character changed, and my family began to notice the difference.

When I understood that God had to come first in everything, and then my family, my life truly began to change. I made a commitment to seek the Holy Spirit and surrendered my entire life to God. That day, I found a joy and peace that words cannot describe. God became my Father, I became His son, and I was no longer alone.

Not long after that, I met my current wife at Love Therapy. We started talking, then dating. Six months later, we got engaged, and six months after that, we got married. Today, I have a beautiful marriage filled with love. All of this happened because I received the Holy Spirit, who changed my life from the inside out. God gave me a second chance at life."

Before coming to the Universal Church, Michele, 35, suffered greatly. One of the main reasons was the

abuse she experienced twice during her childhood. This trauma caused her to grow up with deep emotional wounds, insecurities, and depression.

"When I first heard about the church, I had a very negative opinion. I did not like it at all. I had heard false information that distorted my view, even though I also heard testimonies about people who went there and experienced God's power. Still, I did not want to step inside, even though I was suffering.

I was abused twice when I was very young. At the time, I did not tell anyone because I did not feel safe even in my own home. I was raised only by my mother, and I blamed her for my father's absence and for not being there to help me. I carried this pain and trauma into my teenage years.

I grew up very insecure, afraid of everything and everyone. After some time, I became depressed because I felt sad all the time. I had anxiety attacks. Although I did not have the courage to kill myself, I thought about suicide constantly. I did not know where to go for help or what

to do.

I went to other churches, but I could not find the help I needed. Everything felt emotional and superficial. So I started going out. I went to parties and began drinking. On the outside, I smiled and laughed, but inside I was broken. Only God knew what I was really going through.

I even sought medical help, but the doctors did not know how to treat me or what medication to give me. That was when I decided to give the Universal Church a try. I went with my guard up, but the way I was welcomed and helped was better than I expected.

I decided to give my life to God and leave everything behind. I wanted a new life. I was baptized in water and began seeking the Holy Spirit until the day I received Him. After that, I found strength, peace, and direction. I know God is with me, and no matter what happens, I will be victorious.

Today, I can reach out to those who are suffering and show them that there is a way out."

ARE YOU TIRED AND OVERWHELMED?



“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.” (Matthew 11:28-30). This wonderful invitation was given by the Lord Jesus to all who are tired of carrying so many problems. He wants to remove their weight and pain and give them peace. However, to receive this relief and be able to rest, it is necessary to take the attitude of seeking the Savior above all else.

Based on the understanding that the Lord Jesus calls everyone without exception, it is necessary to understand that the person must also fulfill the request and go to Him. Going to Him means surrendering your life into His hands. Perhaps until now you have struggled alone, and with your own strength, you have only accumulated suffering. But now Jesus wants to take this burden from you. So, recognize that you need Him and submit to His will, for He does not invade anyone's life. Committing to Jesus means renouncing yourself to live a life that pleases Him, and when this happens, all the weariness and all the burdens resulting from problems, worries, and oppressions give way to relief.

The Lord Jesus has already anticipated that with Him, the burden is light. This means that, although struggles continue to exist, when we stop practicing our own will to practice His will, we receive guidance to make the right decisions and thus achieve true peace, as it is written in Romans 5:1: “Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.” “Through faith, we have peace with God. This peace means the tranquility of our conscience when we carry within us the certainty of Divine forgiveness. Peace in the conscience comes when there is nothing that accuses us before God and when we are no longer enslaved by sin. The Holy Spirit made it very clear, through the words of Paul, that this peace with God is the result of faith based on the Person of the Lord Jesus. Therefore, it cannot be achieved through religiosity or good works. This peace begins to take hold of our being when we come to the Altar and surrender ourselves body, soul, and spirit to God. Having peace does not mean not going through struggles. On the contrary, outwardly we may face great conflicts, but inwardly we will be at peace, for we have been reconciled with God through the blood of His beloved Son.

From this surrender, God begins to care for the person, and even if, in human eyes, their situation seems insurmountable, they do not despair – on the contrary, they trust in Him, as did the people whose stories you will read in the following pages.

The search for love became a heavy burden until she found true relief

Until the age of 10, the life of Leticia, a 36-year-old quality analyst, was peaceful. As the youngest daughter, she grew up seeing her family as united and her father as a hero. During her teenage years, however, that image was shattered when she discovered his alcoholism, abuse, and infidelity toward her mother. Her pain grew even deeper when her mother was diagnosed with lupus and passed away shortly after. Leticia was only 16.

Carrying anger and resentment, she sank into emotional emptiness and a series of frustrating relationships. She was baptized in water, but without giving up her own will. Searching for relief, she became involved in harmful spiritual practices and went even deeper into pain. “My lowest point was alcohol, drugs, and prostitution. I felt suffocated and completely lost,” she recalls.

Although she appeared happy and independent on social media, the reality was very different. She was depressed, empty, and unhappy. The burden became even heavier when her older sister developed a serious kidney disease and, later, her father suffered a stroke and passed away. When it seemed that her own life was falling apart, Leticia

met Someone who would change everything.

She had heard about the work of the Universal Church, but because of false information, she believed what was preached there was not true. Seeing her pain, an acquaintance shared her personal experience at the Church.



through water baptism, I truly gave my life to God.”

To make sure the burden would never return, Leticia understood that she needed not a tattoo, but a seal that would guarantee her name in the Book of Life. “I sacrificed everything God asked of me to receive the baptism with the Holy Spirit. Then I heard God say, ‘My daughter, I have always wanted you and I have always loved you.’ That was when I understood that the love I had been searching for was in God,” she says.

Today, she is happy and feels loved, respected, and valued by Him. Free from the weight of the past, she serves God willingly and helps bring hope to those who are far from His presence.

Leticia then decided to put aside her prejudice and attend a service. She describes what happened next: “First, I repented for turning my back on God's Altar and seeking the altar of evil spirits. I had already forgiven my father while he was still alive, and I gave up all sins, alcohol, addictions, wrong friendships, and unhealthy relationships. I surrendered my will, and

burden to her family. She tried to take her own life two more times.

One day at work, Janaina suffered facial paralysis. When she went out to seek help, she struggled to breathe, collapsed to the ground, and had a seizure. At that moment, having never experienced faith before, she says the only thought that crossed her mind was, “I am dying without knowing God.”

A way out for the weary

Janaina recovered, but she developed a deep fear of death and became afraid to sleep. Around that time, at 18 years old, she reconnected with a friend who invited her to attend a service at the Universal Church. There, Janaina heard that Jesus would give rest to all who were weary and burdened and who sought His help. “Through that Word, I found what my soul needed, a way out. I began to see life differently and to work toward that, and everything started to fall into place,” she says.

Despite this first connection with faith, Janaina felt that something was still missing. “I told God that I was tired of those problems, that whirlwind of thoughts, and all the trauma in my life. I told Him that if I did not have the Prince of Peace in my life, I would not be able to go on,” she recalls. According to her, the change began from the

inside out.

“The one who gave me that peace was the Holy Spirit. When I was loved by Him, I was able to pass that love on. The first person who noticed was my mother. It had been years since I told her that I loved her, and in that moment, I hugged her and asked for forgiveness. Before, I thought I would die without seeing God, but from that day on, I began to live because I came to know God,” she concludes.

Janaina de Jesus lived for years in deep emotional suffering and attempted suicide three times until she found the relief she had been searching for. The separation of her parents was something Janaina de Jesus, a press advisor now 30 years old, never imagined would happen. The news of their divorce shattered her joy and destroyed the image of a happy family that she and her siblings once had. As a teenager, Janaina began looking for love and happiness in friends, parties, and relationships to fill what was missing at home. However, when she returned from those nights out, she faced a harsh reality. “In the middle of everyone, I laughed and smiled, but when I got home and opened the door to my bedroom, I found sadness and depression,” she says.

She also recalls being tormented by frequent nightmares. At one point, while trying to ease what she called the pain in her soul, Janaina turned to self-harm. During the cuts, she remembers that the emotional pain faded for a moment, but afterward, along with a deep sense of emptiness, the physical pain from the injuries remained. “It felt like someone was crushing my soul,” she explains.

Dying without God

The emotional suffering led Janaina into constant conflicts with her mother. After one of these arguments, she attempted suicide. From that day on, in addition to the resentment she felt toward her mother, she became haunted by thoughts that she should never have been born, believing she was a

Have you ever noticed how nature draws us in?

It is no coincidence that some of the most photographed things in the world are the sun, the ocean, the mountains, and the starry sky.

When we feel stressed, confused, or trapped, we naturally look for a park, a beach, or a wide horizon to stare at. There is something about nature that speaks to us and pulls us in.

The Bible explains this clearly. “The heavens declare the glory of God” Psalm 19:1. Creation communicates, even without words. That is why, when we search for hope, we often lift our eyes upward.

Deep down, it is as if we already know where help comes from. Even people who say they do not believe in God feel this pull. They may not recognize the Creator, but they

cannot deny the effect of creation. The universe operates under perfect laws. The sun, the moon, the stars, and the seasons all follow a precise order. Every law points to a Lawgiver. Humans did not create these laws, we only discovered them.

That is why Paul said that God’s power and divine nature are clearly seen in what has been made. The evidence is right in front of everyone.

The problem is not a lack of proof. It is unwillingness. Acknowledging God means obeying Him, and many people choose denial so they do not have to change their lives. Still, even when we resist, creation continues to speak.

If you feel a strong connection with nature, understand this. There is a deeper need inside you, the desire to know the Creator of it all. He wants to reign in your life and give you a peace and calm that remain, even in the hardest moments.



At the age of 14, I got involved in a robbery. In my first robbery, I stole about 200 to 250 dollars. It was not much, but for a fourteen year old, it felt like a lot. That experience made me want more, and I went deeper into a life of crime.

I met a man who sold drugs, and I learned from him. Soon, I started selling cocaine myself. At first, I moved ten pounds, then fifteen to twenty pounds, and eventually more than fifty pounds at a time. As the money increased, so did the attention. I was making over 25000 dollars per cocaine sale.

I was bringing in a lot of money, but the police were already investigating the area where I lived because of heavy drug activity, and I was part of it. They hacked my phone, tracked my movements, and eventually arrested a friend and me. I spent two years in prison.

After my release, I went right back to the same lifestyle. I loaded a truck with goods and returned to selling drugs. I turned away from doing what was right and ended up in prison again. At that time, my girlfriend, who is now my wife, was pregnant.



I was transferred to a prison far away from her, and that shocked me. She

was exhausted and emotionally drained. That was when I realized I needed to change. I told her, “I am going to change my life. I spent eighteen years living this way, but if God exists, there has to be a way out.”

Around that time, my friend Jairo introduced me to the Universal Church, and I began attending services. I decided to be baptized in water, and I followed through with that decision. I stopped smoking cigarettes, but one night after leaving church, I gave in and used cocaine again. I felt deeply disappointed in myself.

I remembered the Bible verse where Jesus cursed the tree that did not bear fruit, and it encouraged me to curse this addiction out of my life. I knew I could not do this on my own. I needed the Holy Spirit.

Around 3:40 in the morning, I turned on the Universal Church channel. I woke up, prayed, and felt God speak to me, saying, “You are not alone. I am with you.” At that moment, I received the Holy Spirit, and it became the most incredible day of my life.

From that point on, I knew that if the devil ever tried to tempt me again, he would fail, because God Himself lives inside me. Today, I am free, and my transformation amazes my family. I have a wonderful wife, two beautiful children, and my financial life is also blessed.

Now, it is a joy to help others who face the same struggles I once did. I thank God for His mercy, for giving me another chance, and for allowing me to be an instrument in His hands. As a teenager, I never thought I would reach adulthood, but God restored my life
