A decision that led her to healing

In 2018, during a self-exam, I found a small lump in my breast. At first, it seemed harmless, like a pimple, but it grew quickly and was later diagnosed as advanced malignant cancer. Even with chemotherapy and radiation, the tumor only got worse.

Doctors told me that if it did not shrink, the treatment would become palliative. Although I had been in the faith for many years, I realized something was wrong spiritually. Through prayer and self-examination, I discovered I was carrying deep resentment from my past. I believed I had forgiven my ex-husband, but the pain was still in my heart. That emotional wound had never healed.

I decided to humble myself before God, forgive completely, and seek healing first for my soul. I fasted, prayed, and asked God to help me release all bitterness. When I asked my ex-husband for forgiveness, everything changed. That same day, the tumor burst and began to heal. The treatment started working, the surgery was successful, and my recovery was fast. But the greatest miracle was not only in my body. It was in my soul.

Today, I am completely healed, released by doctors, and living a new life. I learned that everything begins in the heart. When the soul is healed, the body follows.





From darkness to light



In the very first pages of the Bible, we find a clear message: *“And God said, ‘Let there be light,’ and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness”* (Genesis 1:3 to 4). Before anything else was formed, God spoke light into existence and made a clear distinction between light and darkness.

That separation matters. God did not mix the two or allow them to exist together. He separated them so light could be fully experienced for what it truly is.

We see a reflection of this in everyday life. Imagine walking into a room that has been dark for a long time, with the curtains closed and clutter everywhere. You turn on the light, and suddenly you notice things you could not see before. Some things are beautiful. Others need to be moved, cleaned, or thrown away. The light is not the problem. It simply reveals what was hidden in the dark. Once the room is cleared and the windows are opened, the space feels brighter, freer, and more welcoming.

In the same way, God wants to separate our lives from darkness, not to shame us, but to free us. Darkness can be anything that keeps us stuck, such as patterns, thoughts, environments, or habits that grow when they remain hidden. When God brings light, He brings healing, restoration, and new beginnings.

Separation from darkness is not a loss. It is an invitation to truly live in the light God designed for us from the very beginning.

The silence of deep depression



Deep depression can begin quietly and completely change a person’s life. In Shirley’s case, emotional pain turned into anxiety attacks, panic disorder, extreme isolation, and suicide attempts. The suffering reached a point where she lost control of her routine, her health, and her hope, until the moment she decided to seek help.

Hi, my name is Shirley, and I am here today because I survived a very dark season of my life.

Deep depression entered my life quietly, and by the time I understood what was happening, I had already lost control of everything, my routine, my health, and my hope. My emotional pain turned into anxiety attacks, panic disorder, and a level of suffering I never imagined possible.

What confused me the most was that I had always been a cheerful person. I enjoyed working and studying. Suddenly, I felt a sadness and hopelessness I could not explain. Fear took over. Anxiety crises began, followed by panic attacks. I did not understand what was happening to me.

I went to doctors, and the diagnosis was severe: deep depression, panic syndrome, and borderline disorder. I took many medications, but my life only continued to get worse.

As time passed, I entered a constant cycle of emotional crises. I began hurting myself. I cut myself. I tried to end my life. Once, I even tried to jump out of a moving car, and my father had to physically hold me to stop me.

I isolated myself completely. I spent two years inside my bedroom. Two years without showering. My bed and mattress became moldy because I would not get up. I lost all sense of time and of who I was. My hair grew down to my waist, and I did not even notice. My life kept declining, and I could not see a way out.

Inside, it felt like there was a hole in me. I kept falling deeper and deeper, with nothing to hold on to. I looked for relief wherever I could, in people as broken

as I was and in dark environments that matched what I felt inside.

When I saw my life falling apart, I blamed God. I said it was His fault that my life was like that. I believed He was punishing me for leaving the church. Because of that, I made a terrible decision. I chose to serve Satan. I became involved with spirits and things that were not of God, and I changed myself to fit that world. I truly believed that by doing this, my life would improve, but it only became worse.

I tried to escape the pain. I went to beautiful places, beaches, and locations that looked peaceful, thinking I would find peace there. I did not. Life had no meaning for me. That was when I ended up locked in my room for two years.

I was removed from work because I could not function. I could not be around people. Even in beautiful places, nothing filled the emptiness. I stopped believing in myself and in everything else. My mind

became a place of darkness and constant torment, until I reached my limit.

I thought about going back to church, but I felt ashamed. I feared being judged, condemned, and pointed at because of everything I had done. Even with that fear, I made a decision to return and seek help.


What I found was not condemnation. I found welcome. I found guidance.

When I returned, deep inside I knew that if I obeyed what I was learning, my life would change. So I made a decision to obey. One day, I heard a Bible verse that says, “The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.” That word gave me strength. From that day on, something began to change inside me because I chose to believe it.

I realized that my situation was not

God’s fault. He was not punishing me. He wanted to give me a new life.

Within four months, my life completely changed. I received the Holy Spirit, and the emptiness I had carried for so long was finally filled.

Today, I share my story because depression is real, pain is real, and wrong choices can take us deeper into darkness. But help is real. Freedom is real. And with God, it is never the end of the story.

What's happening at Universal

Aggressiveness and depression



"Before I got married, I was a happy person. After I got married, I started to become irritable and deeply

depressed. I felt this way all the time. I yelled at my daughters and my husband constantly. One day, my husband upset me so much that while he was in the shower, I decided to set the curtain on fire so that he would die.

At night, I had nightmares and felt as if someone was grabbing my neck and trying to choke me. Because of that, I started seeking help from witches, but nothing solved my problem. On the land where my house was built, signs of witchcraft began to appear.

During that time, my husband was in a very serious motorcycle accident and was left between life and death. With so much suffering, I attempted suicide by crossing a national road with my eyes closed while holding my young daughter in my arms. But God delivered us from the worst.

After that, I began seeing a psychiatrist and was prescribed medication for depression, but the pills made me feel out of control and disconnected from myself."

A liberating voice

"One day, while driving to work, I turned on the radio and heard a Universal program about deliverance. I decided to go to the address mentioned on the program. Honestly, I thought I was going to a witch doctor or a spiritual center, but when I arrived, I saw that it was a Universal Church. I decided to go in and kept coming.

In just eight days, I was freed from the oppression I felt every day. I noticed that after I started attending the church meetings, I became much calmer, more patient, and more joyful. Over time, I learned how to forgive others and myself. As I stayed focused on God and continued seeking Him, I received the Holy Spirit.

Later on, I was diagnosed with endometrial cancer. The doctors told me I needed surgery, chemotherapy, and radiation. I placed my life in God's hands. I was hospitalized, had the surgery, and three days later I was already back home. I did not need any further treatment because God healed me.

Before, I was an aggressive person. I suffered from spiritual and physical problems, and my marriage and life were destroyed. But when I received the Holy Spirit, I stopped being who I was and became a new person. Today, I have a blessed marriage and a happy family."

For many years, because of a deep injustice, Claudia did not want to live.

"Around the ages of ten and eleven, I was abused by someone very close to me. At that time, I suffered because I did not have my parents' attention. My father was an alcoholic, and my mother was rarely home because she worked hard to support a household with three children.

At school, I was always an angry child because I was bullied. As a teenager, I started drinking and taking large amounts of medication to try to fill the emptiness and ease the sadness I felt. I reached the point of mixing medication with alcohol because I wanted to end my life. Instead, I ended up in the hospital and was admitted for psychiatric care.

Deep in my mind, I heard a voice telling me that I would stay there only for a short time and that I would try to take my life again. I behaved well, was discharged, and went straight back to the same life as before. I do not even remember how many years I lived like that."

No solution

"During that time, my mother never gave up on me. She tried taking me to witch doctors, fortune tellers, and even to a priest to perform an exorcism. Nothing

worked. On the contrary, it increased my anguish and pain even more. I continued attempting suicide because I thought it would end my suffering and my mother's suffering as well. I tried to take my life while my mother was at work, and she even had to take sick leave just to watch over me. I truly believed that death was the only solution."

The invitation

"I was hospitalized again, this time in another hospital, for two weeks. After I was released, I had a breakdown, and the doctors said they could only give me medication to control my depression.

Even after I had my daughter, I still thought about suicide, although I did not attempt it again. Then a coworker of my mother told her about the Universal Church and invited her to take me there on a Friday. When my mother stopped the car in front of the church, I could not even get out. The pastor came to the car, helped me, and prayed for me. From that moment on, I began to notice improvements, so I kept coming. I was set free from depression and suicidal thoughts, and my life started to change."

The change

"At the church, I learned that to receive the Holy Spirit, I needed to let go of the pain I carried from the person who abused me as a child. After doing that, I was baptized in water, persevered in faith, and the emptiness I had felt for so many years was finally filled by the Holy Spirit. From that moment on, my life was truly transformed. Today, I have peace and happiness in my home." - Claudia

Faith and healing

Every Tuesday and Sunday, at all Universal churches, a special prayer is held for people facing health problems who want to see the power of God manifest in their lives. This meeting has transformed the lives of thousands who chose to put their faith into practice and challenge the Word of God.

The main goal is to awaken faith and lead people to react against pain instead of accepting suffering. This meeting is for anyone facing a physical or spiritual health problem, those who are sick, or those with family members dealing with conditions that medicine often cannot diagnose or explain.

Resolve it directly with God

One of the key teachings of the healing meetings is that a person does not need intermediaries to receive a miracle. Just as Hannah, in 1 Samuel 1:10 and 11, went directly to the Lord to pour out her pain and had her prayer answered, everyone is invited to seek God personally, standing on His promises.

Jesus Himself declared that He took upon Himself all our infirmities. A bill is never paid twice. Through faith in the Word, people learn to seek a miracle that has already been promised, and through that faith, healing takes place.

One of the foundations of this meeting is the prophecy found in Isaiah 53:4: “Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows.” This promise becomes the starting point for a personal challenge with God. If it is written, it will come to pass.

Faith is not the last option

One of the most common mistakes people make is turning to God only after exhausting every human resource, medical treatment, and professional opinion, treating faith as a last resort. From the moment a person discovers an illness and begins to act in faith, they prevent the problem from growing stronger and avoid the doubts that try to weaken their confidence in God’s promise. Faith should be the first step, not the last.

An invitation for you

In the past, many people suffered from illnesses, but when they heard about Jesus, they went to Him in faith and received their miracle. The woman with the issue of blood suffered for 12 years, yet she believed that if she only touched the hem of Jesus’ garment, she would be healed. And that is exactly what happened. The same can happen today for those who believe.



condition, she underwent a very risky surgery. During the operation, she suffered a hemorrhage and the procedure had to be stopped. “The doctors told me I would have to take medication for the rest of my life,” she recalls.

The worst was yet to come

Among the many tests she needed, a CT scan brought the worst news: she had nodules in her breasts and treatment had to begin as soon as

surgery did not solve it, but for You nothing is impossible.”

Moved by that certainty, she placed her entire struggle on the Altar. “I determined my healing,” she remembers, adding, “right there I was certain that God had removed all the illnesses from my body.”

Days later, she asked the doctor to repeat the tests. The doctor did not understand the reason and said there was no more time, since the surgery had already been scheduled. “I insisted that she redo the tests. I was sure the surgery would no longer be necessary,” she says.

The confirmation

The doctors were surprised when they saw the test results. They could not believe it was possible. One week earlier, her breasts were full of cancer. Now, there was no sign of any nodules. “The doctor told me, ‘this is not possible. You have been cured of cancer. I am required to discharge you,’” she recalls.

She left praising God for her healing and went straight to the Universal Church to share the news with the pastors and the female assistants who had helped her during that difficult period.

Today, she feels no pain and takes no medication at all. She was healed of both endometriosis and breast cancer. “The one who healed me was not man, nor medication. In truth, the one who healed me was the power of God,” she concludes.

“I said: either the Lord heals me or the Lord takes me, because I refuse to keep suffering.”

The diagnoses could have left Ms. Hessel desperate, but instead they awakened her faith. She suffered for decades from almost unbearable pain starting with her first menstrual cycle at age 12. “I took medications that helped ease the pain, and my mother made all kinds of teas for me, assuming it was just stomach pain,” she says.

However, neither the teas nor the medicines helped eliminate the pain, which grew increasingly intense. The suffering was so severe that she began seeking specialists and, at age 46, after many appointments and tests, she discovered that her condition was caused by a disease called endometriosis.

Because it is considered incurable by medicine, she, who already knew the Universal Church, began attending the Fast of Impossible Cases. She explains how she acted: “I knew that only God could heal me from the pain, but that I needed to fight.”

Due to the seriousness of her

the news about cancer did not make her give up fighting for her life. She scheduled surgery to remove the tumors and continued participating in the prayer chains and spiritual campaigns at the Church. “I went to the Altar and said to God, ‘the

At just 14 years old, Isabella risked losing her arm because of a tumor. Daiane, 34, says she faced one of the greatest challenges of her life earlier this year when she took her 14-year-old daughter, Isabella, for medical care. Isabella was complaining of severe pain in her left arm and a sudden loss of movement.

After a CT scan, they received frightening news. “She had a bone tumor. It was a shock. I couldn’t believe it, and it was very hard to see my daughter in so much pain. She even needed morphine every three hours, but the word that frightened her the most was amputation,” Daiane recalls.

After a biopsy analysis, doctors discovered that it was a benign tumor which, however, was very aggressive and could spread to other bones, such as those in the hip.

Isabella could not even brush her hair or get dressed on her own and had to wear a sling to support her arm. “The doctors said the limb could break at any moment because the bone was completely damaged by the tumor and that, even immobilized, it could fracture on its own,” Daiane explains.

Isabella began treatment at the Children’s Cancer Hospital and, over seven months, went through nine hospitalizations. She took strong medications that caused unpleasant side effects. Morphine was also administered, but nothing relieved her pain. In addition, doctors said there was a high risk that the tumor could become cancerous. “At home, my daughter used very strong medications and even an antidepressant to try to relieve the pain and help her sleep. We spent about \$150 a week. The medications were so strong that she lost hair and weight,” Daiane reports.

Isabella’s parents had already been attending the Universal Church for some years and say that in the most difficult moments they turned to God for their daughter’s healing.



All things are possible to those who believe

“The bad day came into our lives, but we reacted with wisdom. We leaned on the Bible passage about the dry bones (Ezekiel 37) and declared that just as God restored those dry bones when Ezekiel prophesied, the same would happen to our daughter’s arm. We used our faith and made vows on the Altar for her healing. There were months of spending on medication and great pain for her, but we always held on to the certainty of the miracle,” says butcher Leandro, 34, Isabella’s father.

Daiane says she combined medical treatment with faith. On Sundays at the Universal Church, she would consecrate a bottle of water to God in prayer and declare that when her daughter drank it, she would be healed. “Throughout the hospitalizations, I applied the treatment water to her arm and also gave it to her to drink. We took part in healing services at the Universal

Church and never gave up. My sisters joined us in prayer, and that’s when her arm began to move again,” Daiane says.

To the surprise of the medical team, which had stated that some medications would have to be used by Isabella for life, her arm regenerated. In June, the medications were reduced, and in August, the healing was confirmed and the treatment was discontinued.

“Isabella no longer takes any medication. Her life is completely back to normal. The doctors could not explain what had happened to her arm, which was rebuilt, and we said it was the work of God. Following protocol, we will continue taking her to routine appointments and using faith on behalf of our whole family,” Daiane concludes.

My name is Viviane Cristina. I volunteered working with prisoners, offering spiritual support to inmates and their families. Even so, I was arrested for selling counterfeit products. Yes, this is my story.

I came to the Universal Church through UBB eight years before my arrest. I used to listen to the radio late at night and eventually tuned in to a program hosted by a pastor who always invited listeners to attend the meetings. That was when I decided to go.

I arrived carrying problems in every area of my life. I struggled with health issues, financial difficulties, and family conflicts. There was not a single area of my life that had not been affected. When it comes to prison, I admit something very honestly. I was reaping what I had sown. I knew what I was doing was wrong. I tried to leave piracy behind, but I did not have the courage to fully walk away. The main products in my store were pirated CDs.

I spent only a short time in prison, but those were the longest days of my life. When I walked in, I realized it was far worse than I had imagined. There was no place to sleep. The cell was overcrowded.

There was not enough food. Suddenly, I found myself on the other side of the bars, the same place where I once went to help others.

It was there, in that difficult place, that I decided to turn the page of my story. I drew strength from my faith. Prison became the push I needed to truly change. Today, my life is completely different.



God gave me a new chance, direction, and wisdom, and this time I chose to obey. Since then, I have opened several stores of my own.

Today, we have a team of eighteen people working with us. God also blessed my love life, and I am now married. When we choose to obey God, no one can stop the victory He has prepared for us.

To those who have family members behind bars, I want to say this. Do not accept that your loved ones will leave the same way they went in. UBB offers many courses and opportunities inside, but sometimes a person may not want to participate right away.

If you are on the outside, go to a Universal Church near you. Pray for them while holding their photo in your hands. Determine by faith that they will change, just as I did and just as many others have.

To those who are incarcerated, I want to say this as well. I know the atmosphere inside can feel heavy. I felt it myself.

Even there, everything is possible through faith. I have seen


