A person may also gain great wealth through faith, rising from nothing to a position of abundance. Even so, this is not its highest purpose.

Faith can open doors to what once seemed impossible and bring dreams to life. Yet even that does not compare to its true purpose, the reason it exists.

The Lord Jesus Christ, the Author and Finisher of faith, did not give it to us so we could chase the temporary glory of this world. The greatest purpose of faith is far higher. It is to accomplish the greatest and most difficult miracle of all, the salvation of the soul.

It was not easy for Him, the Son of the Almighty and Creator of heaven and earth, to endure scorn, humiliation, shame, and pain so that salvation could be made possible for those who truly believe in Him.

In the same way that He left His glory and accepted the cross, those who desire the salvation of their soul must also surrender their lives. This means letting go of what pulls them away from God and choosing a life of faith and obedience.

Unprotected, rejected and neglected

what pushed me over the edge was dealing with an abortion. I got pregnant after being sexually assaulted at a party. My mind was all over the place, and I felt like I had no choice. I was still a child myself.

Smoking helped me escape for a few hours, but it could not silence the sadness growing inside me. I felt so low that I stopped seeing the point in anything. At 16, I left care and started spending time with drug dealers. I even kept crack cocaine and heroin in my home for them.

After a fight over drugs, I ran to London and moved in with my boyfriend at the time. The relationship turned very toxic. At one point, he knocked me unconscious and ran me over with a car. That was my lowest point. I knew I could not keep living like that, so I tried to overdose on pills.

Some time after I recovered, I was on a bus when I looked up and saw a sign for the Universal Church of the Kingdom of God. I recognized it from a place I had lived before and took it as a sign. I found the courage to go.

At first, nothing really changed because I was still holding back and pretending everything was fine. I felt good while I was in church, but as soon as I left, everything went back

to the way it was. The turning point came on Good Friday. At church, we were invited to nail our problems to the cross. I understood that Jesus had already taken my pain, but if I kept holding on to it, it would continue to haunt me. The choice was mine. That day, I decided I wanted to be free.

I went home, gathered the drugs I had just bought, and flushed them down the toilet. It was my way of saying, 'It is finished. I'm done living like this.' I went to the service ready to face everything I had been running from. From that moment on, I found the strength to fight, to open up about my past, and to forgive my mom and those who hurt me. That was the beginning of my change.

It has been a few years since then, and that feeling of finally having a home, of being wanted and loved, has never left me. I am no longer suicidal or dependent on weed. Today, I am looking forward to building a family of my own. I am engaged and will be getting married this year."

After a simple surgery, an unexpected diagnosis

Valquiria Garcez, 52, a public administrator, faced a serious health challenge in 2021. While at the gym, she began to feel abdominal pain and later developed a fever, which led her to seek medical care. Doctors diagnosed her with acute appendicitis, and she underwent emergency surgery. The procedure went well, but a follow up exam revealed something unexpected. The removed tissue showed a rare type of cancer known as tubular adenocarcinoma of the appendix. The news brought shock and fear, and doctors informed her that she would need a second surgery.

Despite the emotional impact, Valquiria chose to rely on her faith and face the situation with strength. The second surgery was successful, but her recovery was very difficult. She became extremely weak, could not eat, and experienced constant vomiting. Doctors warned that if her condition did not improve, she might need a feeding tube and a longer stay in the hospital. Even in that condition, she remained firm in her faith. She followed church services on her phone and continued praying. In the middle of that struggle, she made a vow to God, believing that her situation could change.

After a very difficult night, something unexpected happened. She suddenly began to improve. She was able to eat again and, to the surprise of the medical team, she was discharged the very next day. Later, biopsy results confirmed that there was no trace of cancer. The tumor had completely disappeared. Valquiria believes her healing came through her faith in God, and today she shares a message of hope. Never give up, even when everything seems to be going wrong. God has the final word, and victory is certain for those who believe.

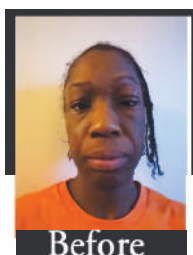

Soul sickness



Imagine going to a coworker's wedding with your spouse. When the bride calls all the single women to come forward for the bouquet toss, would you join them. Of course not. That moment is not meant for you. You are already married. It is an invitation for those who are single.

In the same way, people who are healthy do not go looking for a doctor. Those who seek help are the ones who know they are not well and need care.

So what does this have to do with you. You may feel fine on the outside, but what about your inner life. When Jesus spoke about this, He was talking to people who believed they were fine. Many times, the ones who think they are okay are the ones who need help the most.

Maybe your soul is hurting. And the pain in the soul can go deeper than any physical pain. When the body suffers,

there are treatments, medicine, and therapy. But when the soul is wounded, healing requires something more. It requires turning to God.

As it is written in the Bible:

“When Jesus heard that, He said to them, ‘Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick.’” Matthew 9:12

Take a moment and look within. Be honest with yourself. It is like taking an x ray of your soul. Are you truly at peace, or is something unsettled inside you.

You are usually the first to notice when something is not right within you. The question is what will you do about it. Will you look for healing, or will you ignore the need.

When my world fell apart, God rebuilt me

I turned to drinking and smoking, trying to numb the emptiness, but the pain inside only got worse. I felt a deep sadness that I could not explain. I cried all the time.

After experiencing so much success, ending up in that condition broke me. The depression became so strong that I avoided daylight. At one point, I stayed isolated in a room for two months. A voice in my mind kept telling me that my life was over, that I was nothing, and I believed it. I lost a lot of weight and became aggressive.

From having everything, my life quickly fell apart. I could not work, I got into debt, my checks bounced, my credit cards were canceled, and everything I had built started to collapse.

At my lowest point, when I had nothing left, not even money for bus fare, I heard about the Universal Church of the Kingdom of God. With no hope and nothing to lose, I decided to go.

There, I started attending the chain of prayer for total healing

Depression is more than sadness. It is a deep and silent emptiness that consumes a person from within. It can affect anyone, no matter how successful they seem or how perfect their life looks. Behind smiles and achievements, there can be a hidden pain that no one else sees. It steals joy, drains purpose, and makes a person feel like there is no way out.

Many try to fill that emptiness with distractions like success, relationships, or substances, but nothing truly satisfies what is missing inside. The darkness grows heavier, the thoughts get louder, and hope starts to fade. It becomes a battle in the mind and in the heart, often fought alone.

This is the story of someone who seemed to have everything, yet found herself trapped in that emptiness until she discovered that there is a way out, and that depression does not have the final word.

“I was a successful model and dancer, living what many people would call a dream. My work took me to countries like Switzerland, Italy, Spain, and Brazil. I had everything I thought I needed. I had my own apartment, financial stability, and multiple sources of income. Life felt complete.

But everything started to change when I began feeling intense pain in my feet. I went to several doctors, but no one could find the cause. As the pain got worse, I could no longer continue modeling or dancing. Losing what gave my life purpose affected me deeply, and I fell into depression.

I became bedridden. Even with medication, nothing seemed to help.

THE SOUL IN PAIN

When pain goes beyond the body No one likes to feel pain. When our body hurts, it is a warning that something is not right. It pushes us to seek help before the problem gets worse. Modern medicine, with all its advances, plays an important role in moments like these. It helps relieve pain, identify the cause, and treat what is happening inside the body.

But not all pain is physical. Some wounds go much deeper. There is the pain of rejection, guilt, loneliness, deep sadness, grief, and loss. These are wounds of the soul, and only the person going through them truly understands how heavy they feel. Even though they are invisible, they can last much longer than physical pain. Many people try to hide this kind of pain. They distract themselves or try to numb what they feel, but the emptiness does not go away. Just like with physical pain, if we want real healing, we need to deal with the root of the problem.

When the pain reaches the soul, there is only One who can truly restore it, God. He knows every part of the human heart. The Bible says that He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds in Psalm 147:3. When we open our hearts to Him, He not only comforts us, but also restores what we have lost, our peace, our strength, and our hope.

Every Sunday, we hold a special gathering for those who are carrying pain, sorrow, or spiritual burdens and have not found a solution. You will learn how to place your pain in God's hands and experience the peace and restoration that only He can give. Look at the back page to find the location closest to you.



I remember being alone in my pool, and the thoughts would not stop. They kept telling me, 'Kill yourself. There is no point in living. No one likes you.' It felt like I was losing the battle in my own mind.

I have an uncle who practices witchcraft. Because he did not want my mom to be with my dad, he carried a lot of hatred toward him. That is why he would do harmful things against my family. At one point, my mom became very sick. After she passed away, it felt like everything that had been against her came against me.

That is when things got even worse. I started experiencing things I could not explain. At night, I would see shadows. I would hear voices. I would wake up around three in the morning hearing someone call my name. Sometimes I could not even move. It always happened at the same time, and it terrified me.

I was scared and kept everything to myself. I thought people would say I just wanted attention. I was also afraid to tell my dad because I did not think he would believe me.

It got to the point where I tried to take my life four times. The first time, I tried to cut my veins. The second time, I drank bleach. The third time, I tried to overdose on pills. The fourth time, I tried to drown myself.

Then I was invited to attend the Chain of Prayer at the Universal Church of the Kingdom of God, especially the Friday service focused on deliverance. That was exactly what I needed. The first change

I noticed was that I could finally sleep at night. But I became completely free when I received the Holy Spirit during the Fast of Daniel, which lasted 21 days. It was not easy. I had to give up things like watching TV and being on social media, and focus on my spiritual life.

The hardest part was letting go of my past and the hatred I carried. It felt like I was going through a spiritual detox. Toward the end, I prayed and said, 'My Lord, I do not accept finishing this fast without receiving Your Spirit. I have given up everything I needed to. I want You to come into my life right now and make me new.'

At that moment, I had a deep certainty inside me that I was no longer the same person. I did not need to feel anything special or hear music. It was just me and God.

The Holy Spirit completed me. He filled the emptiness inside me. From that moment on, I had a desire to talk about Jesus to everyone I knew, my friends, my contacts, and my family. I also felt a strong desire to serve Him.

Today, my life is completely different. I am free from the trauma, the anxiety, the fear, the things I used to see and hear, and the suicidal thoughts. The Holy Spirit filled me and gave me peace. My family has been restored. God has completely changed my life." - Elizabeth Ayala

in her marriage. My mother-in-law found out about everything I was going through. She was already an assistant at the Universal Church, so she invited me to go. I remember it was a Sunday at 10 in the morning.

FAST OF DANIEL MAY 3 - MAY 24

Fast of Daniel: prepare for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost

The Fast of Daniel begins on May 3 and continues through May 24. It is a time of full surrender and stepping away from the distractions of this world. The goal is to focus on God's voice, so participants avoid secular information, entertainment, and social media. This edition carries even greater spiritual weight because it aligns with the Pentecost purpose already taking place throughout the Universal Church.

The context

This journey is not happening on its own. Right now, the Universal Church is living out the anointing with the oil that was consecrated on April 5. This symbolic act prepares the way for what is coming in May.

The promise: the focus is to receive or renew the Holy Spirit.

The biblical example: in Acts 2, the Bible shows that the Holy Spirit came upon those who followed the Lord Jesus' instruction and remained united.

The goal: we are preparing for our own Pentecost, seeking the same outpouring that happened in biblical times.

The voice of the altar

Bishop Edir Macedo highlights the importance of unity and the prophetic meaning behind this purpose. He said:

“We will be praying, united in one faith and one spirit, directly from Jerusalem, from the place where the Holy Spirit first came down, so that He may come upon all the earth and all who believe in the Lord Jesus.”

He also explains what defines a true Christian: “The Church of the Lord Jesus is made up of those who are born of water and the Holy Spirit. Jesus said that what is born of the flesh is flesh, but what is born of the Spirit is spirit. This means a person receives a divine nature. So the Church of the Lord Jesus is formed by those who belong to His Kingdom, those who were born of the Holy Spirit.

On May 3, we will begin the Fast of Daniel, which continues until May 24, the Day of Pentecost. During this time, each day you should seek God and set yourself apart so the Holy Spirit may come upon your life.”

How to take part in the Fast of Daniel
Taking part in this purpose requires commitment and intention. It is not a fast from food, but from information.

Avoid all secular content. Stay away from news, movies, music, and social media that do not build your faith.

Focus on spiritual content. Read the Bible, watch messages that strengthen your faith, and disconnect from worldly distractions.

Stay consistent in your daily time with God. The Lord Jesus told His disciples to remain in the promise of the Father, so daily prayer and seeking His presence are essential.

Why take part

The main goal is what the Bible calls the new birth. We live in a noisy world, and the Fast of Daniel creates space to hear God clearly. As the purpose ends on May 24, the expectation is that many will experience a true transformation within or grow even stronger in their faith. Stay connected for more updates throughout this period.

change my life, but it was hard to do it on my own. That is why I decided to go back. I had to distance myself from both friends and enemies. I had lived that lifestyle for so long that it was not easy to change. I even remember going to the church

It all started in secondary school. I lived in one of the most dangerous areas in London.

began spending time with them, and we would assault people, rob shops, and damage property.

My parents were unemployed at the time, so I did not have what my friends had, like an allowance or new clothes. I felt different from everyone else.

Things only got worse. I kept getting suspended from school for fighting, and I was arrested for the first time for robbery. At that time, my parents had no idea what I was doing. I lied to them and said it was a case of mistaken identity, and they believed me.

Because I wanted what they had, I started looking for a quick way to make money. That is when I began robbing people and bullying other students at school.

When I turned 13, I started looking up to the older boys in my area. They had everything I wanted.

I did not know how they got those things, but they showed me how to get them. I

while still carrying drugs. That first meeting made a big difference. I spoke with an adviser who had lived a life similar to mine. The change in me was clear, and it even led my family to start attending the church. Today, I am a different person. My parents once saw me as a problem, but now they are proud of me. I no longer rob or hurt people.

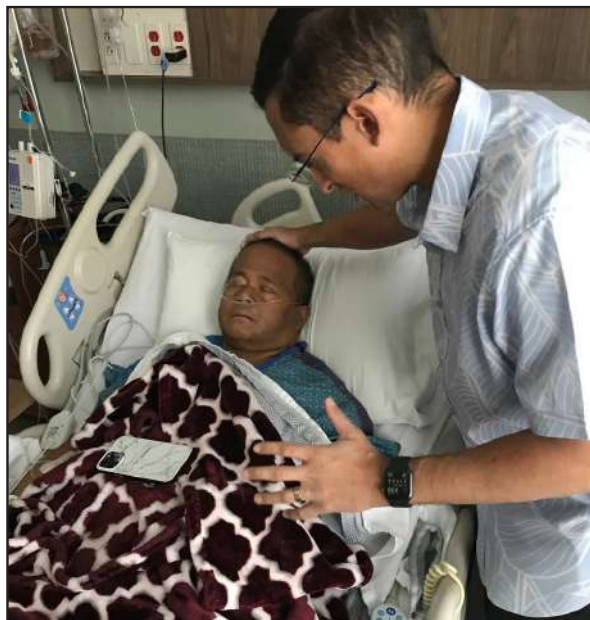


During these visits, they prayed for healing and strength, trusting in God's power to restore health and bring peace. Along with praying for physical healing, they also focused on spiritual care.
