"Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered Isaac his son on the altar?" (James 2:21)

When you have to travel and cannot take your child with you, who do you trust to care for them?

Would you choose someone with questionable character?

Someone with a history of aggression?

Someone who does not even take care of their own children?

Of course not. You would not even think about it.

You would choose someone you trust, someone responsible, someone with good character. That is what gives you peace of mind.

The same principle applies to the altar. This is what it represents. Abraham trusted his son to it.

What God did in Abraham's life did not happen by chance. What is the point of having faith if you do not fully trust the altar of the One who gave you that faith?

Abraham received far more than he ever asked or imagined. And he continued to receive, and will continue to receive, until the return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The

A mother's faith changed her daughter's story

good are your degrees? They are useless because you do not know how to raise your child."

One day, trying to escape the torment, she turned on the TV and came across a program from the Universal Church. As she listened to the pastor, she felt a sense of peace and wrote down the address to visit.

At church, Maura began using water consecrated to God. "I would make her tea and juice with that water, but suddenly she refused to drink it. I tried cleaning her room, but she would not let me go in anymore. So I started using the water in the washing machine, and everything seemed to get worse. One day, I got home and found a goodbye letter from Luiza. I went looking for her and found her trying to jump from the balcony," she says.

Maura then took part in a purpose to place her children on the altar. "I prayed, 'My God, I have tried everything for this girl. Now I understand that only You can help. So I place my daughter in Your hands. Luiza belongs to You.'"

Within a few days, Luiza, who was 12 at the time, began interacting with her family again. Her behavior at school changed, she joined the Youth Power Group, was baptized in water, and received the Holy Spirit.

What seemed like the beginning of a new life brought another challenge. Luiza was involved in an accident. When Maura heard the news, she prayed for God's will to be done. When she found her daughter at the scene, Luiza asked, "Who are you?" and "What happened?" Moments later, she said, "God saved me."

Luiza was discharged the same day, but the doctor said she would lose three years of memory. That included the time when her mother had been fighting for her through faith. But the Holy Spirit is not just a memory or an experience. Despite medical advice to rest for 30 days, after only three days, Luiza chose to return to church.

"When I placed Luiza in God's hands on the altar, He honored it. He took care of her and saved her. Today, for His glory, she is a blessed daughter, used by God, and an example to her younger sister," Maura says.

"All the glory belongs to God, but without my mother's faith, none of this would have happened," Luiza adds. "She was my foundation. She fought for her lost daughter and for a broken family. She was patient, strong, and above all, she depended on God. She planted for years, and today we are seeing the results of her sacrifice and faith. I used to hate her, but today she is my friend, my example of faith, strength, and perseverance."

Illness awakened her to intelligent faith



After receiving a serious diagnosis and facing a treatment she could not afford, Patricia found a new direction for her life through faith. It started when lesions appeared and spread across her body, along with intense itching and emotional distress. She was diagnosed with guttate psoriasis, a chronic autoimmune condition. The high cost of the recommended treatment made the situation even more difficult.

Encouraged by her sisters, who attend the Universal Church, Patricia decided to turn to faith. She began going to services and chose not to accept the diagnosis as the final word. At the same time, she looked for a more affordable medical option, combining treatment with the practice of faith.

With perseverance, she began using consecrated water in prayer. Soon, she noticed clear improvement in her symptoms and in the quality of her sleep. Her recovery was fast and unexpected, to the point that even the doctors recognized the progress.



Patricia says her healing came through her faith in Jesus Christ. Today, she celebrates restored health and shares that, beyond the physical healing, she learned to depend more on God and grow spiritually.

A happy mother indeed



There was a woman in the Bible who made a vow for her son. She said, “Lemuel, the son of my vows.” Like many mothers, she cared more about her son than herself.

Hannah was another woman of faith. She was not able to have children, and that caused her deep pain. She cried often because she longed to be a mother. But one day, she stood up and made a vow. From that moment on, everything changed. Hannah became a joyful woman, and soon after, a happy mother. The tears stopped.

How many women today find themselves like one of these two? Some are mothers who carry deep concern for their children. Others feel pain because they do not have

children or because they lost them to drugs, death, or other struggles.

Lemuel’s mother had no reason to cry because her desire was fulfilled. A vow carries power. It brings blessings to your life, your home, and your family.

What has made you cry? The Lord wants to wipe away your tears. If you have been a suffering mother, there is a message from God for you.

The Word of God says, “Put my tears into Your bottle. When I cry out to You, then my enemies will turn back. This I know, because God is for me” (Psalm 56:8).

God sees every tear. Wherever you are, you can say, “God is for me.”

May the God of the Bible bless you.

“The doctors said there was nothing more they could do.”

Flu like illnesses are common in both adults and children. According to the World Health Organization, between 20% and 30% of children are affected by these viral infections each year. While many recover without complications, some cases take a serious turn due to health conditions, environment, or individual factors, increasing the risk of severe complications and making treatment more difficult.

That was the case for Maxwell Marques, now 15 years old. He was a healthy child with no major medical history, but at the age of 7, a simple flu turned into a life-threatening situation and led to his admission to the Intensive Care Unit.

“During that time, we went to the hospital several times, tried different treatments, and he did not improve,” recalls his mother, Mary Ellen Marques, 38, a hairdresser. “Then the doctor noticed his oxygen level had dropped to 79%, when it should be above 94%. They performed procedures to keep his body oxygenated until he was transferred to the ICU, where he had to be intubated because he could no longer breathe.”

Initial tests showed pleural effusion, which is a buildup of fluid in the lungs caused by inflammation. “That same day, while he was already in the ICU, his fever



spiked, and he went into respiratory arrest, followed by cardiac arrest. The doctors were able to revive him, but I was in shock and had very little information. All I could do was ask people I knew to pray,” she says.

The next day brought even worse news. Maxwell had developed kidney failure. “When I saw him, he was extremely swollen. I could barely recognize him,” Mary Ellen recalls. “The doctors told me there was nothing more they could do and that his chance of survival was only 1%. They suggested I call the family to say goodbye. I was in shock. I could not process anything else.”

Watching her son fight for his life was overwhelming. “I did not want to focus on the odds,” she says. “I asked what could still be done. The doctor suggested dialysis, and once it started, the swelling began to go down. But every day I heard



negative words, that he would not survive, or that if he did, he would have permanent damage.”

While the medical team continued their work, Mary Ellen turned to her faith for strength and hope. She was already familiar with the Universal Church and chose to trust in God instead of questioning the situation.

“I prayed constantly,” she says. “I used the consecrated water from church, anointed him, attended prayer chains, and made vows on the altar.”

As she strengthened herself spiritually, she made a firm decision to reject the negative words around her and believe in a miracle. “I held on to God’s Word the whole time. Then one day, he coughed and began to show signs that his lungs and other organs were working again.”

Maxwell’s condition started to stabilize,



which was the first victory. The next challenge was overcoming the long-term effects doctors had predicted. “All the doctors said he would have some kind of limitation,” Mary Ellen explains.

“But we kept believing. He went through treatment and made a full recovery, which surprised everyone.”

This experience also impacted others. “Other mothers saw what happened and were inspired,” she says. “They began to use their faith, started going to church, and their children were also healed.”

Today, Maxwell lives a normal life. He has no limitations, no lasting effects, and does not need any ongoing medical care.

“God completely healed him,” Mary Ellen says. “I saw the supernatural and felt God’s presence throughout the entire process. This experience made me stronger. I depend less on people and more on God.”

“A mother’s faith. A child’s transformation.”

Have you ever stopped to think about the true meaning of the word “mother”? Let’s look at two definitions: “a woman who has given birth to or raised another person and helped shape their development,” and “someone who makes life easier for others by offering care and support.” This second definition clearly shows why a mother’s presence is so important in a child’s life. Whether the child is biological or adopted, when a woman chooses to take on the role of caregiver and protector, she becomes a true mother. And among everything she does, teaching, guiding, correcting, and disciplining, there is one role that often goes unnoticed, her influence.

A mother’s influence is so powerful that it can affect the entire atmosphere of a home. When she is happy, that joy spreads to her children, her husband, and those around her. But when she is down, the whole environment feels different. Understanding this is important because it helps a mother learn how to manage her emotions and build up her home. At the same time, life is not always simple. There are situations that go beyond human control, and every mother has her limits. That is why it is essential to rely on faith and walk closely with God, praying and interceding for the family.

The value of a mother

Throughout the Bible, we see the care and attention the Lord Jesus gave to Mary. She was chosen by God to carry Him, guide His first steps, and raise Him. But she was given that responsibility because she stood out. Scripture gives us a glimpse of her character and purity, as when the angel said, “Blessed are you among women,” and “You have found favor with God.”

Jesuina Sena has powerful testimonies about transformation in her family. She first came to the Universal Church looking for help for her children, who were dealing with drug addiction and getting involved in fraud. “I had already tried other religions, but nothing changed in my home. When I finally came to church, it took me some time to truly understand and follow what I learned from the altar,” she shares.

Even though she was present in her children’s lives, Jesuina struggled with extreme anger. “I would have outbursts and break things around the house. That anger affected my relationship with my children and often pushed us apart.”



“I would have outbursts and smash up the entire house”

As her children grew older, they gained more independence. “Daniel started going to parties as a teenager and using drugs in secret. One day, while washing his clothes, I found drugs. When I asked him about it, he avoided the question and said they were not his, but that was not true.” She often saw her son under the influence and did not know how to handle the situation. But everything began to change when she learned how to use her faith.

Jesuina explains that the first step was to change herself. “When I had my Encounter with God, I changed from the inside out. I gained strength to keep going and wisdom to know how to act.”

Her transformation had a direct impact on her children,

even as adults. “My mother completely changed. She became calmer, more peaceful, and clear-minded. The way she lived her faith caught my attention. She saw the problems I was facing and gave me advice in a calm and wise way, not with pressure or judgment. That made me listen to her, and it led me to my own decision to follow God,” says Daniel Zaminhani.

Her faith also influenced her second son, Marcelo, and their wives.

“One thing I held firmly in my heart was that no matter how long it took, I would keep fighting until I saw the power of God in my family,” Jesuina concludes.

“Arguments at home became frequent”

Cristiane Palomino is the mother of four daughters. She first came to the faith when her girls were still young, and with the wisdom she received from God, she built a strong and healthy foundation for her family. At that time, there was peace in her home, and life was going well. “We even opened our own business,” she says. But with the demands of daily life, she slowly drifted away from her faith.

“As time went by, everything we had built fell apart. Arguments at home became constant. We lost our business. I found a job, but soon after I lost it. On top of that, I fell into depression,” she explains.

According to Cristiane, this situation also affected her daughter Larissa Muniz. “I became overwhelmed with my own problems. I isolated myself and cried all the time. My daughter started having problems at school, and I did not know how to deal with it. She also became withdrawn. She stopped talking and kept everything to herself. One day, she told me she had been abused as a child and that she was developing feelings for other girls,” Cristiane says.

Larissa admits that she did not trust her mother, and their relationship got even worse after that conversation. “We argued all the time. She could not accept who I was, and every family gathering turned into a fight,” she says.

Cristiane remembers that things only got worse. “Larissa left home at 14. My anxiety went through the roof. She started staying out late, drinking heavily, and even changed her appearance to look more like a

man. I tried to avoid the situation and did not even want to go home anymore. That is when I realized there was nothing I could do. Only God could change my life,” she says.

Before she could fight for her family, Cristiane knew she needed to rebuild herself. “I gave my life completely to God. I started going to the Universal Church every day, from Monday through Sunday, seeking what came from the altar. Little by little, my worries about my daughter stopped controlling me. Not because I did not care, but because I had placed everything in God’s hands,” she explains.

After she dealt with her inner struggles, was baptized in water, and received the Holy Spirit, everything changed. The woman who once lived in sadness began to radiate peace.

“From that moment on, I had peace inside me. My attitude changed. I became strong, confident, and sure that I would see my daughter’s life transformed,” she says.

It did not take long for others to notice, including Larissa. “At some

point, I saw that my mother had changed. She was happier, treated me well, and showed me love. She drew close to me, and that made a big difference. When I realized that the emptiness inside me would not go away, no matter what I tried, I decided to turn to God,” Larissa shares.


Today, Cristiane celebrates the results of her prayers and the vows she made on behalf of her family. “I was able to guide my daughters in the

ways of God and show them what truly matters. Larissa is completely different now. She is walking in faith and is married to a man of God,” she says.

Cristiane makes it clear that everything started when she chose to seek God. “I know that if I had not taken that first step, I probably would not be alive today, and my family would be destroyed. God is everything to me. Even though I still face challenges, I have peace, and I carry that peace with me because He is the one who gives it,” she concludes.

You are not alone!

My name is Nathan, and this is my story

“

Ever since I was a little boy, I always felt the need to do wrong. When I was eight years old, I would steal my grandfathers' cigarettes and start to smoke them. As I got older things got worse for me, by the age of 12 I was already smoking cocaine.



From a young age, trouble followed me. I always felt drawn to doing the wrong thing. I was not a normal child. I grew up dealing with addictions that carried into my teenage years. At eight years old, I was already stealing my grandfather's cigarettes and smoking them. By the time I was 12, I was using cocaine.

I remember when my mother sold the apartment we lived in. She believed the problem was our environment and the friends I had in that neighborhood. But that was not the case. Wherever we went, I found trouble. One day, my mother sent me to the corner store to



buy bread. In less than half an hour, I came back home high on drugs. I did not care about anyone. I became violent. I would fight, threaten people, rob, steal from home, and sell what I took. I would take advantage of people without caring who I hurt. My mother did everything she could to keep me busy and off the streets.

After selling the apartment, she had about 10,000 dollars. She tried to help me by giving me responsibility. She used part of that money to open a business for me. But because I was irresponsible, she ended up in debt. The business failed, and she lost the money she had invested.

Deep down, I wanted to change, but I did not know how. So I kept living the only way I knew, as a drug addicted and destructive person. My mother spent a lot of money trying to help me. She sent me to rehab and tried to keep me out of trouble with the law, but nothing worked.

Then my mother found the Universal Church. At first, I did not pay much attention. But I remember the day she went for the first time. That same day, I had assaulted someone from a gang, and they were looking for me.

The gang leader even went to my mother and told her to prepare a coffin because they were going to kill me. At that point, I felt like I had nothing to lose. I was already in trouble with the law, involved with gangs, and going in and out of rehab.

Death did not even scare me anymore. But one day in January, I decided to go to church with my mother. After that day, something changed inside me. For the first time, I believed that my life could be different.

I started going to church every day. I wanted more of the peace I felt there. I began to seek guidance from the pastor, ask questions, and most importantly, I obeyed and put into practice what I learned. Little by little, my faith grew stronger. I overcame my addiction, the anger, and the hatred I carried.

I stopped living without care for others and began to value people. I wanted to give others what God had given me. Today, I thank God that my mother found the Universal Church (Universal Beyond Bars). If it were not for that, I do not know where I would be.



I am no longer a trouble maker, my mom does not have to worry about me. God is now the Master of my life, and He guides me daily, I enjoy life in His presence .



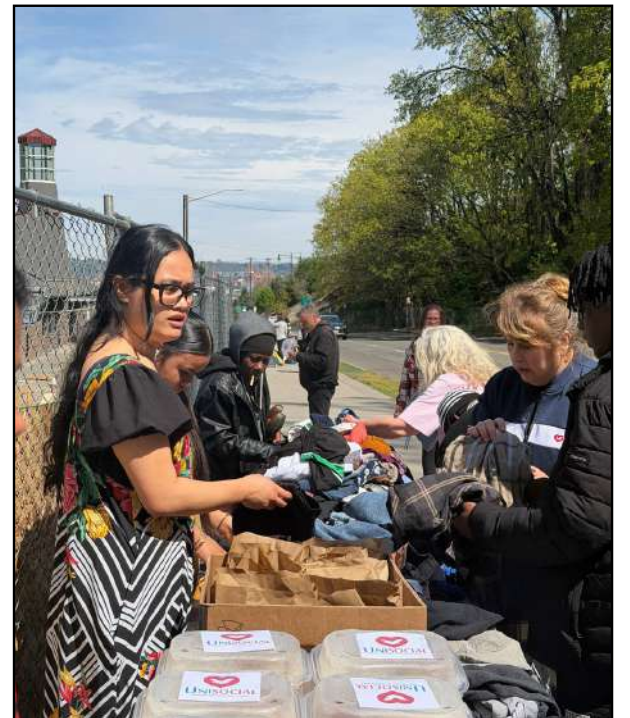
